Greetings on Pentecost Sunday

May 20, 2018

Here's a short story I heard a few years ago that may help us to better understand the relationship between Pentecost and using the gifts we receive from God.

There was a woman who had four grown sons. She had lost her home to fire, so the sons thought it would be good to build their mom a new home. But, they ran into trouble. The first son was a carpenter, but he didn't know anything about plumbing, masonry or electrical work. So, he thought there was no way he could build his mother a home. Each of his brothers – an electrician, a plumber and a bricklayer – had similar thoughts. They didn't know anything about their brother's skills, so thinking only as individuals, they each decided there was no way any of them could build a new home for their mom. So, the house never got built.

Our life as a Church is kind of like this story of the mother and her sons. How often do we think that our Church couldn't possibly need or make use of our God-given talents? Sometimes, we might find ourselves thinking that we can't participate in a bible study or a parish meeting (how could we have anything beneficial to offer?). Maybe we think we could never stand up in front of the congregation and read from the scriptures. We might even think that our Church doesn't need us because we can't do anything spectacular. Maybe we feel we don't have any special talents to share with anyone, so why should we even consider volunteering at our parish?

Let's think for a moment about the broad, diversity of gifts that are necessary to bring our parish to life. The life of our parish is not just about those whose talents we see and hear at Mass. It's also about those whose talents are used "behind the scenes" so to speak ... the people who launder the linens used at Mass each week, or the person whose steadiness in prayer encourages others to do the same. The volunteers who work in our Religious Formation programs. Those who help put together our weekly bulletin, those who assist with our parish recordkeeping, or those who quietly attend adoration to pray for those less fortunate among us ... all contribute tremendously. Preparing a dish to be shared, or volunteering to help out at a funeral lunch can help bring comfort and healing, as much as an open, listening ear and a compassionate heart.

God continues to pour out the Holy Spirit to touch each of our lives. Pentecost is all about being able to see and to understand how God has touched each of us with gifts that are necessary for the life of our parish and Church. Yes, some gifts are used more visibly, but every God-given gift is essential, and we are meant to be stewards of these gifts and talents.

Pentecost is about believing that the power and the gifts of the Holy Spirit have been poured out on each of us. Those individual gifts can be combined and put to good use in humility and generosity. Pentecost is just like building a house, together, that no one person can do all by themselves. It's about building up the Church ... the Body of Christ.

Sacred Relics of the Saints: Treasures of the Church

Exposition of Sacred Relics Of 150 Saints St. Mary's Catholic Church, Fosston, MN

Fr. Carlos Martins, CC, will present at St. Mary's Parish, 725 6th St. NW, Fosston, MN, a teaching and exposition of Sacred Relics on **Friday June 1 at 6:30 PM**. Father Carlos Martins of the Companions of the Cross with his special ministry will teach about these holy objects. He will bring with him over 150 relics, some as old as 2000 years. Among the treasures will be relics of St. Maria Goretti, St. Therese of Lisieux (the "Little Flower"), St. Francis of Assisi, St. Anthony of Padua, St. Thomas Aquinas, and St. Faustina Kowalska. In addition, there will also be present a portion of the veil of Our Lady, as well as one of the largest remaining pieces of the True Cross in the world. Those in attendance will be able to examine and venerate each relic. In the Church's history many miracles and healings have been worked in the presence of relics, and many have been healed through this ministry. You are encouraged to bring your articles of devotion (such as rosaries, holy cards, etc.) and pictures of ill friends/family members which you will be able to touch to the reliquaries as a means of intercession.

The veneration of relics is a communion with the heroes of our Christian faith, asking for their powerful intercession. Many people have reported outstanding blessings and conversions through this ministry, and many have reported healings. (www.TreasuresOfTheChurch.com) Fr. Carlos Martins, CC will begin the exposition with a presentation and teaching on relics, which provides the catechetical and spiritual basis for the Walk with the Saints that follows the presentation. The point of the teaching is to present the basic Gospel message of Jesus Christ: that God is here right now and wants to be encountered; He touches us through the lives and the sacred remains of His Saints.

The atmosphere during the exposition needs to be one of reverence. No refreshments will be served and no items sold even if they are religious articles.

This is free to the public, but there will be free-will donation baskets available.
