Holy Trinity Sunday Greetings,

We are now in a season of the Church called Ordinary Time. With busy lives, it is anything but Ordinary... life happens around us, things change, we need to feel grounded and secure. Our faith tells us, God can provide for our needs.

At the start of Vatican II Pope John XXIII said: "History is the teacher of life. History is the key to understanding." It is in the stories of life shared with others that we gain wisdom and understanding. It is in the liturgies, the rituals, the sacred vessels used, the recorded documents, and the collected stories of the People of God that we place history at our service. Vatican II also called for a full and active participation of the faithful... At the recent "priest days" Bishop asked each parish to be very aware of the impact some of our actions have on the participation of the faithful.

We are called to actively listen to the readings at each mass. Our Proclaimers, influence us by: preparing their readings in advance, using inflection and tone to help us listen to the "Word of God." When they Bow and Pause at the end of the readings they are inviting us to contemplate the message we have just heard. They show respect for the word they are about to proclaim as they approach the ambo with reverence.

We receive many compliments regarding the quality of the music and singing here at St Philip's and St Charles. Please continue to use your voice to give glory to God by singing all the songs. Our choir and cantors work hard to encourage us to be part of the vocal expression of worship. Please open your songbook and join in the celebration fully and actively. The cantors and choir will invite you in...

After Communion, Jesus is taken to the Tabernacle to be reposed and brought to the sick and shut-ins. We invite you to participate by bowing or making the sign of the cross as He is brought past your position in the pew. We are also invited into a minute of prayer. The posture can either be sitting, kneeling, or standing... IN SILENCE... use this time to thank Jesus for being part of your life. Let Him know how you will be taking Him into your life situations... or simply rejoice at being in His presence and His presence in you... In short --- take in Jesus.

We all are called to be disciples... We use our gifts and talents to make the community stronger and welcoming.

Our parish needs volunteers to help with funeral luncheons... Are you available? Can you help? This ministry is so important to grieving families who need a place and time to share with each other.

We are thankful for the disciples who worked on a committee that prepared a long-range plan for Holy Cross Cemetery. Their work will have a lasting effect on the beauty, care and maintenance of the sacred grounds that have been entrusted to us and that we will pass on to those who follow us.

Are you aware vocations to priesthood and religious life come from someone hearing: "you would make a good priest or sister" or "you have qualities that would help us grow as a people of God"? In August the Diocese of Crookston is offering *Esto Vir!* a vocation camp for young men (age 16+). This camp is an opportunity for young men who may be open to the priesthood to come together and spend some days in community with each other and the seminarians of the diocese. A closing thought: We do not want to repeat the hurts of the past but find a way to help with healing. We need to allow Jesus to cover the wound in our heart and soul with His love. The wound does not disappear, it is a part of our life experiences, but the emptiness or hurt can be transformed by Jesus. Jesus is the answer. Jesus will take the hurt and make it into a blessing if we allow Him to be a part of the healing.

I pray daily that Jesus helps with the healing of hurts and hearts that ache. I pray that we are willing to let go of the hurt and let God heal us. Blessings, *Fr. Chuck*

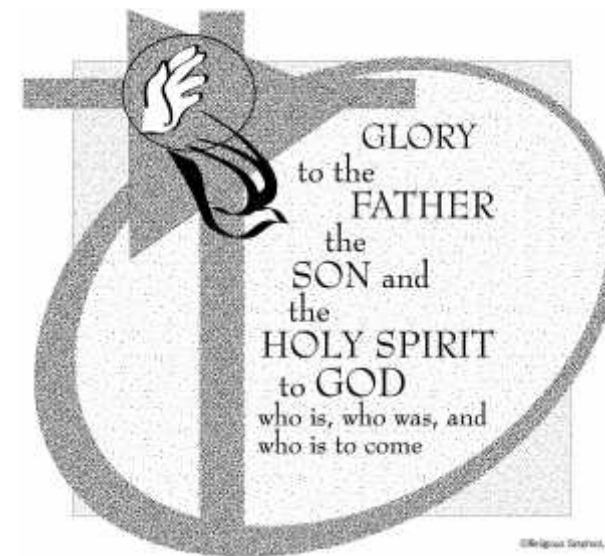

Sacred Relics of the Saints: Treasures of the Church

Exposition of Sacred Relics Of 150 Saints
St. Mary's Catholic Church, Fosston, MN

Fr. Carlos Martins, CC, will present at St. Mary's Parish, 725 6th St. NW, Fosston, a teaching and exposition of Sacred Relics on **Friday, June 1 at 6:30 PM**. Father Carlos Martins of the Companions of the Cross with his special ministry will teach about these holy objects. He will bring with him over 150 relics, some as old as 2000 years. Among the treasures will be relics of St. Maria Goretti, St. Therese of Lisieux (the "Little Flower"), St. Francis of Assisi, St. Anthony of Padua, St. Thomas Aquinas, and St. Faustina Kowalska. In addition, there will also be present a portion of the veil of Our Lady, as well as one of the largest remaining pieces of the True Cross in the world. Those in attendance will be able to examine and venerate each relic. In the Church's history many miracles and healings have been worked in the presence of relics, and many have been healed through this ministry. You are encouraged to bring your articles of devotion (such as rosaries, holy cards, etc.) and pictures of ill friends/family members which you will be able to touch to the reliquaries as a means of intercession.

Fr. Carlos Martins, CC will begin the exposition with a presentation and teaching on relics, which provides the catechetical and spiritual basis for the *Walk with the Saints* that follows the presentation. For more information, go to www.treasuresofthechurch.com.
