Greetings on the Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

June 17, 2018

Last weekend our liturgical year switched back to what we refer to as "Ordinary Time." But we shouldn't think of Ordinary Time as being unimportant time, but rather that, for the next twenty-one weeks, we'll be digging-in to the riches of the mystery of Christ in an "ordered" way. We'll be reflecting on everything that we celebrated in Easter and maybe even reflect on our long-forgotten Lenten resolutions. And we'll be thankful for God's faithfulness and presence in our lives and in the life of His Church.

There's a saying that could encapsulate today's readings: "Small is beautiful!" Indeed, as we examine the life of faith, it's often the little or insignificant things that are the focus of God's presence. We remember that the young shepherd-boy David slayed Goliath and went on to become a great king; the apostle Paul, whose name means small, became a great evangelist and preacher; Teresa of Calcutta began her mission with almost nothing, yet became a saint whose work continues to inspire millions. Indeed, "small is beautiful!"

Jesus uses the images of the sower and the small seed to help explain the Kingdom of God. Despite any misconceptions, the work of faith is ultimately God's work ... as quiet and out-of-sight as the growing seed. We're called by God to be like the sower; to make the soil ready; and to be generous in sowing the seeds, but then to back away and let the Lord bring forth the harvest. Jesus expands the use of this image. Small as it is, the mustard seed has the potential to be the largest of all shrubs. In other words, a person can't judge the size and potential of anything by its initial size, least of all the Kingdom of God! Just as the tiny mustard seed that grows-up to be a huge shrub in which many birds will find shelter, so God's Kingdom must grow to provide shelter to everyone from all nations. It must become like Ezekiel's tree in this weekend's first reading ... awesome, and full of the fruits of the Kingdom.

We're reminded by St. Paul in our second reading to have courage ... and to remember that our ultimate destiny isn't of this world. We are to walk by faith and not by the fleeting ways of this world, no matter how tempting or convenient they might be. We need to be a prayerful people ... people who are always growing in their faith ... always aware that one day, we will have to give an account for our lives. We must know that our humble, but sincere efforts, even if to us they may seem small and insignificant, will be richly blessed by our Lord.


