From the Desk of Fr. Bryan

September 2

It's been a rough couple of months in the life of the Catholic Church with all of these scandals going on. I was especially surprised when I read the letter of Archbishop Vigano, accusing Pope Francis of having knowledge of Archbishop Theodore McCarrick's corruption and enabling his misdeeds back in 2013. For everyone living on earth right now, this is a time unlike any other. None of us have ever heard of a pope doing such things. Like you, I want the truth to be revealed. I want every deed of darkness to be brought into the light. The Catholic Church, the Bride of Jesus Christ, is suffering in a bad way. In a way, it's fitting that we have turned our calendars to September. This month is traditionally dedicated to the Seven Sorrows of Mary. What great suffering Mary had to endure as she watched her Son's Passion and Death on the Cross! And now she suffers with us today as she watches the shepherds of the Church lead the lay faithful away from, rather than closer to, her Son.

We cannot lose hope, though! For Jesus, after his Passion and Death, rose from the dead victorious! Although we suffer now, we know Jesus will bring his Bride through the darkness and into his marvelous light. The night may grow darker as more scandal is revealed, but all of it can be healed once the Church has been purified of its corruption. Another source of hope: From the darkness, the Lord always raises up saints to inspire us and shine the light of Christ into our lives. There are so many saints for us to admire! As we look into their lives, we can see that they were oftentimes surrounded by a culture of sin and darkness. Yet, by the grace of God, they clung to Jesus and lived lives that were truly holy, breaking the pattern of sin around them and establishing a new pattern of being consumed by the Word made flesh. What a gift they are for us!

September offers us some truly remarkable witnesses: a very holy pope in Gregory the Great (3rd), one of the best preachers ever to live in John Chrysostom (13th), one of the apostles in Matthew (21st), the three holy Archangels Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael (29th), a whole group of Korean martyrs (20th), and a saint who has inspired many to love the poor in Vincent de Paul (27th). These holy saints are sure guides to Christ. Imitate them as they imitated Christ! We also have the birthday of Mary on September 8th (the Immaculate Conception is December 8th) and the Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows is on the 15th, which is preceded by the Feast Day of the Exaltation of the Cross on the 14th. Cling to these holy days this month as the Church is purified. Draw close to Jesus and he will draw close to you. Be assured of my prayers for you. Pray for me.

May the Lord give you his peace!

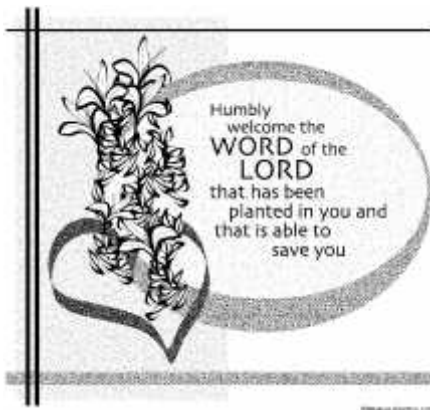

NEW THIS YEAR

Safe Environment Volunteer Information

Volunteers at St. Philip's Parish and School (and throughout our Diocese) who have contact with children, youth and vulnerable adults must have yearly Safe Environment Training and must yearly fill out the Acknowledgement and Consent Form.

Safe Environment Certification begins July 1, 2018 and ends June 30, 2019 (this is new this year). All Volunteers (Returning and New) should do the Safe Environment Training as soon as possible, to be Safe Environment Certified for this year. We would like to have ALL Volunteers Safe Environment Certified by October 1, 2018. For example, if you did your Safe Environment Training May 13, 2018, please do your Safe Environment by the October 1 deadline. ***Volunteers are not cleared to volunteer until the Safe Environment Training, the Acknowledgment and Consent Form, a current background check are completed, and a Safe Environment Certificate is issued to the Parish from the Diocese Safe Environment Office.***

Safe Environment Training is offered through the Diocese of Crookston. The training consists of reading Safe Environment Training materials and taking and passing a test. **The recommended method of training is on-line through the Diocese of Crookston Web Site – www.crookston.org** (follow the Safe Environment links). The **Acknowledgement and Consent Form** is also completed at this time. The Web Site is secure. A hard copy of the test is available by contacting the parish/school staff person who oversees you.

First Reconciliation Parent Session

It is the policy of the Diocese of Crookston that the reception of the Sacrament of Reconciliation precedes the reception of First Eucharist. A parent must attend one of the sessions in order for the child to receive the sacrament, regardless if you have attended a session in the past.
