Crisis, a Layman's Perspective by Aana Freihammer

September 23, 2018

I received a message from a friend the other day asking me how I could still be a part of the Church after all the latest news reports about the clergy sexual abuse crisis. I didn't know how to respond because like you, I am horrified, embarrassed, and angry over what seems like a never-ending scourge. I am also concerned for the priests that have not done anything and are now looked at with constant suspicion. My anger is further exasperated by my feelings of absolute helplessness to resolve this issue. I thought this was done sixteen years ago! To learn we still have cover ups of misconduct is horrifying. I have no answers.

I have grown up in a Church after 2002 when thousands of sexual abuse reports came to light through a Boston Globe report. I have always worked in a church where everyone receives background checks and complete questionnaires raising awareness on sexual abuse. I falsely assumed the Church had their act together, only to find out it is not the case. At times I am deeply conflicted on whether the Church is a safe place to raise my children and a place where they will encounter Christ. When members of the Church have lost so much credibility, I question their ability to be a role model for me *and* my children.

The only small peace I can share is that *the Church is not the clergy*. Our definition of Church comes from the word ecclesia, or in Greek, *Kyriake* which means "what belongs to the Lord" (CCC 751). The Church is the Eucharistic people of God and much bigger than just one part. Of course, we are all one body, connected by these parts, and we are responsible for each other. However, the Church's credibility as the beacon of the Holy Spirit was never dependent on its members. Thank God! The Church is made up of humanity but is more than our mortal frailty and short comings.

I end with a quote from an interview with author Brandon Vogt that has helped me begin to sort through this difficult time in the Church.

Any attempt to downplay the horrific sex abuse crisis is misguided at best. Catholics need to fully face what happened, which includes not only the despicable abuse itself, but the cover up by many priests, bishops, and Church leaders, the very people we're supposed to trust. I totally understand why, for many people, the abuse crisis has undermined the Church's credibility and why so many feel unable to rejoin the Church. I get it and it pains me deeply.

*But with that said, there seems to be an unfounded leap between the statement "many Catholic leaders contributed to abuse" and "therefore, the Catholic Church has nothing to offer" or "therefore, the Catholic Church is not the Church that Jesus established." **The Church's credibility is not grounded on the behavior of its members.** The important question is not whether its members are angelic, but whether its claims are true. Was the Catholic Church really started by Jesus? Was Jesus really God? Did he really rise from the dead? Do the Church's sacraments actually do anything?" ~Brandon Vogt (Interview with Angelus News)*

Please join me in praying for the victims of this horrible abuse and pray for an end to this crisis through greater accountability and transparency. This is not enough, but it is a start. I have hope that God is bigger than this mess.

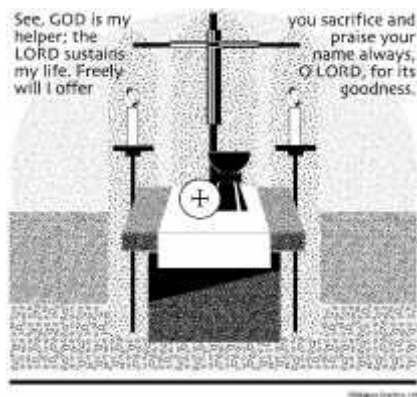
