Greetings on this Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time.

October 21, 2018

This weekend's reading from Isaiah sets the stage for Mark's Gospel by speaking to the question of human suffering. As people of faith, suffering seems to go against our basic image of God as loving and caring, and as we encounter so many instances of suffering, we're often left with the question, "how can God allow this to happen?"

Throughout history, philosophers and theologians have tried to come up with a good answer to this question. For some, suffering is a divine punishment; for others it's a test; or perhaps an opportunity to strengthen our faith, or, for still others, to demonstrate our virtue or fidelity. Yet in the end, suffering is still a mystery ... something that's beyond our understanding. Often, we look for an answer in sacred scripture. Isaiah tells us that "*the Lord was pleased to crush Him in infirmity*", and Hebrews tells us that Jesus was "*similarly ... tested in every way.*" At first glance, neither reading appears to help us much. But if we "*put on our eyes of faith*", we can see that these readings are not only meant to explain suffering, but also are meant to help us realize that, even in suffering, we can find good.

The *Suffering of the Servant* has purpose and meaning. Isaiah tells us that through suffering "*He shall justify many.*" The term *justification* implies that we've been acquitted and restored to right-relationship with God, and that *someone else* has paid the price. Christ, in *His* suffering, has paid the price so that *we* can *approach the throne of grace and receive mercy and grace.*

Discovering meaning in suffering is also part of this weekend's Gospel passage. Having walked in the glory and fame of Jesus, the disciples want something more ... a place of status and glory in the kingdom. What they're surprised to hear is that authority and leadership in the kingdom isn't about glory but instead is about self-giving ... even to the point of suffering and death. Clearly, this is just the opposite of the disciples' world-view.

If discipleship and authority have a new meaning in the Kingdom, isn't it reasonable to conclude that suffering, too, might have a new meaning? While suffering can't be avoided or even fully explained, it *can* be used for a greater purpose: we can learn from it and, as people of faith, join our suffering to those of the Suffering Servant ... whom we now recognize as Christ. Maybe, then, our sufferings might not seem so unexplainable or meaningless. Maybe, then, we might be able to become Christ to others ... an image of the Servant in the midst of our world. Not only did Christ experience suffering, as we do, but ultimately overcame it through His Resurrection. Our hope is that, we too, may now share in His triumph.

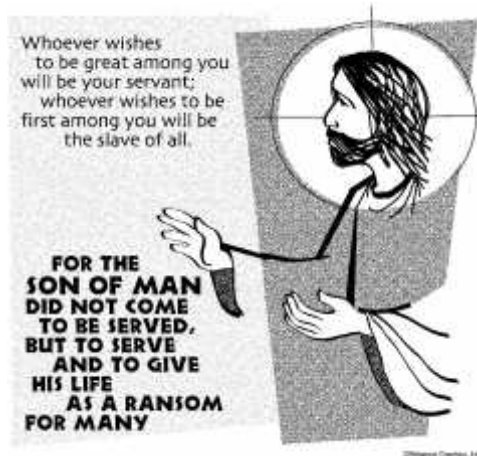
