As we approach the end of the liturgical year, we notice that the readings at Mass seem to focus on events that will occur at the "end times." We call this theological study of "end times" Eschatology.

In this weekend's first reading from Daniel, written at the time when the Jewish people had been conquered and exiled to Babylonia, more than five hundred years before the birth of Jesus, we hear the prophet Daniel speaking about damnation and salvation. It was a time of war and enslavement of the Jews, and Daniel's vision described the ultimate triumph of good over evil and light over darkness ... a feat we know was accomplished in and by Christ, both on earth and in heaven.

In the same way, we hear Jesus in Mark's Gospel where He refers to the end of time when "And then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in the clouds' with great power and glory." "But of that day or hour, no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father," Jesus said. However, with Jesus' image of the sprouting leaves on the fig tree, His very presence in the world was a powerful sign that the "Day of the Lord" is *always* at hand, calling us to live in "right-relationship" with God and each other. Maybe, if we knew the day of our death or the moment of Christ's return, we might put-off living a life of faith and abandoning our old sinful ways. However, we've been left in a state of suspense by our Lord, where the anticipation of His return should remind us that we should be living both the corporal and spiritual works of mercy every day, so that we'll be prepared when Christ returns.

These mysteries are described perfectly by the apostle Paul's Letter to the Hebrews. Paul reminds us how in the Mass, we see memorialized "for by one offering, He has made perfect forever those who are being consecrated." As we get ready to celebrate the end the current liturgical year and the beginning of a new one next Sunday with the coming of Advent, we should keep in mind that although "Heaven and earth will pass away, but my (His) words will not pass away." Indeed, the saving words of our Lord Jesus Christ will endure forever.

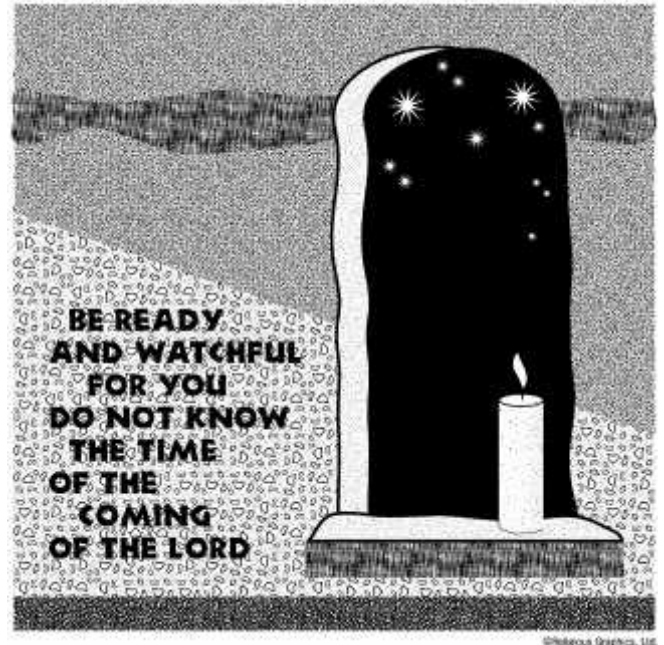

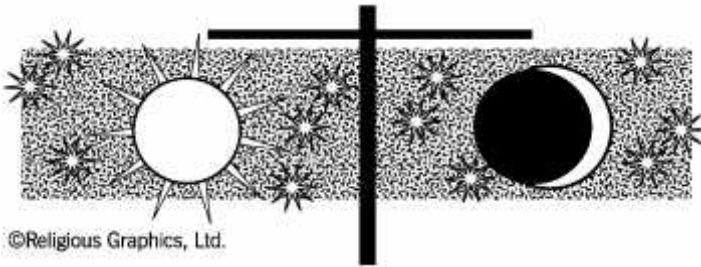
40 DAYS FOR LIFE

Words written by the late Cardinal John O'Connor in July 1990:

"Nothing changes the objective reality: abortion kills babies in their mothers' wombs. Abortion is not merely the removal of some tissue from a woman's body. Abortion is not the removal of a living 'thing' that would become human if it were allowed to remain inside the woman's body. Abortion is the destruction of an unborn baby. Pregnancy is the period for this new human life to mature, not to 'become human' – it already is. This is why the Church considers abortion the killing of a human being, and why the Second Vatican Council called it an 'unspeakable crime'."

FAITH FORMATION

Looking for a great way to share our faith on a Sunday morning...

Preschool Sunday School (held during the 9:00 a.m. Mass) has openings for **Substitute Catechists** (teachers) and **Catechist Assistants** - assist a Sunday or two or the whole year - great opportunity for school volunteer hours or for Middle School or High Schoolers. A **Preschool Coordinator** is also needed, this is a paid position.

Children's Liturgy of the Word (held during the 9:00 Mass) needs a few **Leaders**. Leaders are assigned a week-end a month (or less depending upon how many leaders we have) to lead a group of Kindergarten and First graders who attend the 9:00 Mass in making the Sunday Gospel reading relevant to their lives and experiences. Children's Liturgy of the Word leaders must be available at the beginning of Mass to lead the students out of Mass following the opening prayer and return the children to Mass after the Prayers of the Faithful.

Adaptive Faith Formation

Each child is unique with his or her own special talents and abilities. When a child has special needs, it's even more important to teach to a child's strengths in helping them learn and grow in faith. We offer families *Adaptive Finding God* - Faith Formation for Children in Grades 1-8 with Autism and Special Needs. *Adaptive Finding God* provides the tools and guidance to help all children participate in their faith. Adaptive Learning Kits are available to help prepare children receive the Sacraments of First Reconciliation, First Eucharist and Confirmation. - ✦ Please detach, and fill out the information slip on the side of the label, and drop in the box or collection plate.
- ✦ Feel free to partner with another family or your workplace to fill one!
