Happy new year!

Yes, like with so many other things, the Church does not follow the rest of the world in the cycle of a year. Our year always begins with Advent, which is a different date each year but always around the same time of year - four Sundays before Christmas. "Advent" means, "the arrival of a notable person, thing, or event". Of course we know who that notable person is: Jesus himself. He has come into the world, born as a baby, and we celebrate his arrival at the end of Advent on Christmas Day. But Advent is also intended to help us prepare for the next time Jesus will arrive on earth, which will be at his Second Coming when he will judge the living and the dead. This season allows us the opportunity to examine our lives to see whether Jesus will find us ready for his arrival. Will we be ready and excited for him to come, free from all sin and earthly attachments? This is the big question for us to ask and answer, because Jesus could come again any day, even before this Christmas. When he comes again, the world as we know it will end. Scripture tells us that some will be taken with Jesus into the New Jerusalem, while others will be left out in the dark. Obviously, we want to be those who are taken by Jesus, but that means we need to find out what qualities and characteristics he's going to be looking for. It's a good time for us to recommit to reading the Bible on a daily basis and studying what the Church teaches about everything. It's a perfect time to recommit to growing in our relationship with Jesus and his Church.

This month is traditionally devoted to the Immaculate Conception. The Lord God had to prepare the earth for the Incarnation of his Son, so he prevented Mary from being conceived with the stain of Original Sin. He took the graces of the Crucifixion and applied them to Mary when she was conceived in the womb of St. Anne. God isn't limited to time and space in the same ways we are, so he was able to make sure he played his part to prepare the world for the advent of Jesus. **We celebrate the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception on Saturday, December 8th. This day is such a big deal that's it's a Holy Day of Obligation**, which means your attendance at Mass is expected that day or the evening before. Since it's on a Saturday this year, that means we get to come to Mass twice that weekend. *A person could fulfill their two obligations by attending Mass on both Friday and Saturday evenings, Saturday evening and Sunday, Saturday morning and evening, Friday evening and Sunday, or Saturday morning and Sunday (no two-for-one specials by coming only on Saturday evening!)*. It's a great opportunity for us to take extra time for the Lord during this busy season of the year!

I'm running out of space, but there are some great saints and feast days this month. Obviously, the two big ones are Christmas (25th) and the Immaculate Conception (8th), but there are some other well-known days. St. Nicholas (6th) day would be a great day for "Santa" to come to your house - that way, your family could focus entirely on Jesus on Christmas morning. There's also the Apostle John (27th), Stephen the martyr (26th), a missionary who baptized something like 700,000 people - Francis Xavier (3rd), the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe (12th), the Feast of the Holy Family (Sunday after Christmas), and still more great saints! Enjoy this month in your preparations for Christmas and in your preparations for the Lord's Second Coming.

May the Lord give you his peace!

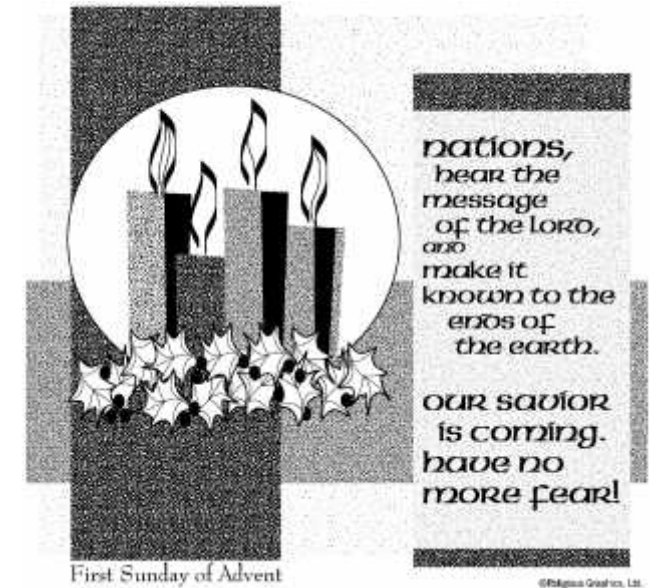

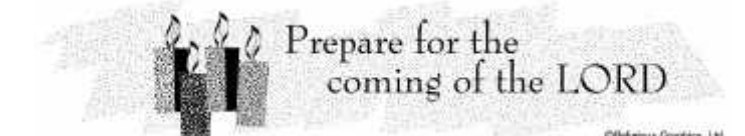

Mass Times Survey Update

First, thank you to everyone who thoughtfully considered and responded to our recent survey about Mass times. Your feedback helps us learn more about your priorities and concerns. Here's the update, followed by an explanation: **There are no immediate plans to change Mass times at St. Philip's.** Our committee collected all survey responses and presented a recommendation to Fr. Chuck. Then Fr. Chuck and Fr. Bryan reviewed average Mass attendance and concluded that although two Sunday morning Masses would work during the school year, they wouldn't accommodate the summer congregational increase. Rather than causing confusion by creating different summer and school-year schedules, we will keep the current Mass schedule: 5:30 PM, Saturday, 7:30 AM, 9:00 AM, 11:00 AM, and 6:30 PM Sunday.

Making a data-based decision to serve the parish is a positive step. However, one of the factors that prompted the survey remains unresolved. From the comments included in the surveys, people feel strongly about the Mass time they choose to attend. However, we don't necessarily see that sense of priority translate into ministry volunteers. Our current Mass schedule (along with weddings and funerals) overextends our clergy and current liturgical volunteers. Every weekend we need between 120 and 150 volunteers to serve in some capacity, and we do not have the volunteers to fill all these roles.

We heard from many of you that you didn't want your favorite Mass time to change, and we empathize with that reaction. Now, we are asking you to consider yourself a steward of our Catholic faith—someone who has gifts to share as a greeter, usher, sacristan, Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion, and captain. We ask you to step forward as one of the 20 new volunteers needed each weekend.

Next week we will be holding training for those interested in becoming Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. If you would like to participate in this training or you are interested in any other ministry, please contact Aana Freihammer 218-441-4905 in advance.

Prepare In Joyful Hope

Advent marks the beginning of the Church's liturgical year, the four weeks of before Christmas (in Latin it means, *the coming*). The sights and sounds of Advent tell us Christ is coming. The season sharpens our sense of the world's need for a savior, and of the great mystery of God's becoming human for us, the incarnation.

Advent is an opportunity to shed the temporary world around us and prepare our minds and hearts for the coming of Christ. We celebrate the three comings of Christ: His birth in the past, his mysterious coming through his Church and the sacraments, and his promised return as our Judge at the end of time.

This is the time to wrestle with the mystery of God coming to earth so we can live with him forever. This season reminds us that we are playing the long game, not living for this world, but getting ready for the next.

The Church adorns itself with purple, symbolizing repentance and joyful expectation. Church decorations are more simple, representing the austerity of our time of waiting. An Advent wreath will be placed near the ambo, and the four candles are symbols of Christ as the Light of the World who overcomes the darkness.

As you prepare for Christmas, please pray for those who are traveling or those who may not be familiar faces. Please welcome them. Make room for them and say hello. We all are disciples celebrating the birth of Christ.

At home, celebrate with your own Advent wreath, lighting the candles before meals or before bed time. Replace screen and phone time with shared activity. Perhaps your family can make a special effort to help out the less fortunate either by helping at the Clothing Depot, Food Shelf, Giving Tree, or Tubs of Love. These purposeful activities provide a counterpoint to the most hectic and consumeristic time of the year.

Take advantage of the many resources offered online through FORMED (add sign up instructions) or use a different app or book to help you focus on prayer (adventurereflections.com, ??, etc.) Consider getting up a few minutes early to spend a few minutes of silence in God's presence. Be sure to attend our "Day of Grace" December 13. Priests will be available **7 AM -7 PM** to hear individual confessions.

Throughout Advent we will be learning more about the liturgy, the most important prayer of the Church. Father Chuck and Father Bryan will be teaching us about the parts of the liturgy during our weekend Masses.
