Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The image of a wedding is often used in the Old Testament to describe God's relationship with His chosen people, Israel. Even though the Israelites were often unfaithful, God always forgave them and took them back. As the Israelites waited for the coming of the Messiah, their hopes were expressed in terms of a wedding – a time of great rejoicing and celebration, and, like abundant wine, God's blessings would be poured out on His people in abundance.

So, when we hear the story of the miracle at Cana, it's difficult not to get a glimpse of the shadow of the cross. Like all of Jesus' signs and miracles, this points to the greatest of all His signs: when He will be lifted-up in obedience to the Father, for mankind's salvation. This will be how the newest and most true identity and glory of our savior will be revealed.

Significantly also, Jesus' mother is in attendance at the wedding. In calling her "woman", a title he will also use as He hangs from the cross, Jesus is referring back that to another woman, Eve, through whom sin first came into the world. Here now, through this woman, Mary, His mother and through whom Jesus came into the world, the healing of that original sin will begin in her Son.

For Christians, the cross of Christ is the ultimate blessing, as it's the source of eternal life. Also, the many gallons of wine at the Cana wedding represent the inexhaustible riches of God poured out on faithful believers. Just as a wedding is a sign of who we are and what we hope for, so the miracle of Cana is a sign of what God offers us if we place our faith and trust in Him.

Through the death and resurrection of His Son, God offers us more than we could ever hope for. Not only the gifts of the Spirit as we see listed by Paul in Corinthians, but God also offers us fullness of life and love. It is through faith that the water of our daily lives, with all its challenges and accomplishments, can be transformed into a great wine, something of excellence, full-bodied, and with a deep quality and bouquet. Through faith, our lives acquire a new depth and meaning if we simply do as Mary says: "*Do whatever He tells you.*" Jesus let His glory be seen and the disciples began to believe in Him.

Servants of Shelter Update

Servants of Shelter (SOS) was delayed in opening its doors this year – but it is NOW open and operating. This temporary homeless shelter uses church facilities, and rotates to a different church each Sunday of the shelter season. SOS will operate the months of January, February and March, and St. Philips will serve as the Hosting Church from February 10 – 17. We will use Mt. Zion Church in Nymore for this week. (since St. Philips School will be in session that week, our facility is not available) The shelter is open from 4:00 each afternoon through 8:00 A.M. Guests are provided with dinner, breakfast, and a sack lunch each day.

The guests that use Servants of Shelter are required to get a voucher through one of the following agencies: Churches United, Bi-CAP, Village of Hope and the Law Enforcement Center. By requiring the vouchers, the program is assured that the guests have been screened and background checks have been done. SOS requires this in order to provide a safe environment for the people using the shelter as well as for our volunteers.
