Hello, everyone!

February 3, 2019

February may be the shortest of all the months, but it often seems like the longest to me. It starts to seem like the winter weather has no end in sight and the days don't really seem like they're getting that much longer. It actually reminds me of a great quote I heard a few years back: "The night is darkest just before the dawn." It might *seem* like there's no end to winter in sight, but the season actually ends the very next month. With the new season, the weather usually starts getting warmer and fresh life begins to blossom. What a gift! When I keep my mind on that, I know I can make it through this final full month of winter. It's similar to the spiritual life: When I keep my sights on eternity, I can endure any suffering or trials that come my way. It's the eternal perspective that gives me the strength to persevere and to not get caught up in things that are of less significance than the joys that await me in Heaven. What an even better gift for those who receive it! Let's ask the Lord to give us this grace to keep our eyes fixed on Heaven.

This month is traditionally dedicated to the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. It is a good time for us to meditate on the life of the Holy Family and, if we have a family at home, try to imitate them as well as possible. In looking at the Holy Family, we begin to understand the life of Jesus. Of course, the first thing to notice is that we don't see much at all during the first thirty years of the life of Jesus - only one short scene in the Gospel of Luke is all that we see after the visit from the Magi. This reminds us that family life is, in so many ways, a hidden life, a life without glamour. This goes contrary to what so many of us are seeking, namely to be noticed by others and to have a name for ourselves or our family. Yet it is in this hidden life that we realize we are noticed by the only one that truly matters: God himself. He notices your hard work and sacrifice for your family. He notices all of the times you've had to selflessly care for your children or your spouse. He notices all of the seemingly meaningless tasks you've had to accomplish just so your family can function. And he's been so glad to be there with you and love you in those moments. Beyond this first characteristic, we can also see a family that didn't allow evil into their home. Jesus is God and Mary was immaculately conceived, but Scripture even refers to Joseph as a righteous man, which means he did everything in his power to live in a right relationship with the Lord God. The same ought to be true for your family. Avoid sin at all costs, and do not even allow evil into your homes. Make it a priority to hold each other accountable and to build up within one another a spiritual castle which can be protected by the strong walls of virtue and holiness of life. May the Holy Family pray for each one of your families!

Finally, we have some more great saints and feast days to celebrate this month. On the 2nd, we celebrated the Feast of the Presentation. 40 days after Christmas, Joseph and Mary obediently brought their baby boy to the temple to offer him to the Lord. This is a great reminder for all of us to offer all of our prayers, work, joy, and suffering to the Lord each day. We also look at the life of St. Blase (3rd), which is a day for the blessing of throats (which we're doing at all Masses this weekend). We also have some great martyrs in Agatha (5th), Paul Miki (6th), and Polycarp (23rd). There's a recent saint in Josephine Bakhita (8th) - a great movie about her life can be found on Formed.org (called *Bakhita*). We also remember the appearance of Mary at Lourdes in France, one of the most popular Marian apparitions of our age as countless people have experienced physical healing at the grotto there. There are more saints, but we'll finish by mentioned the Feast of the Chair of Peter on the 22nd. It's a great day for us to rejoice in being Catholic-Christians! We remember the words of Jesus in the Gospel of Matthew, *You are Peter and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it.* The church that Jesus built is the Catholic Church and Peter was our first pope, so we rejoice that we live in the house of the Lord and worship in his Church! Let's now go and bring others into this great house of protection and grace.

May the Lord give you his peace!

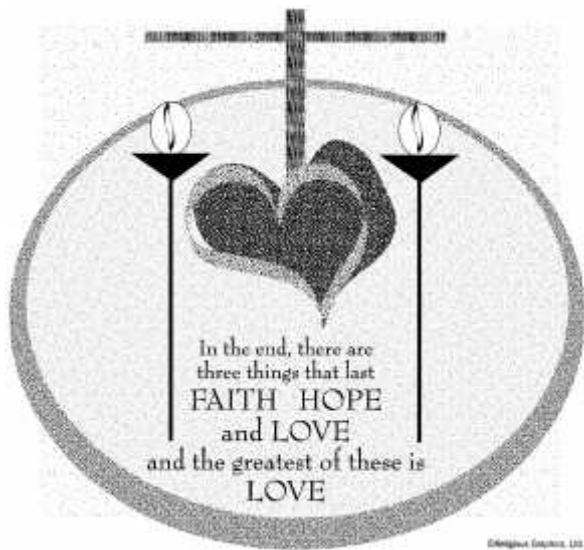

**Spiritual Direction Available at St. Philip's**

Spiritual direction is a ministry of prayerful, contemplative listening offered to another within a confidential one-on-one or a small group setting.

This ministry is especially helpful for people who are seeking the following:

- To know and understand God's call—growing in discernment.
- To recognize God at the center of all things.
- A deeper prayer life, one that yields real intimacy in relationship with Jesus Christ.

Our Spiritual Director, Tamara Moore, is a Catholic laywoman in good standing with the Church. She is married with four children, has earned a Master's degree in Theology (2005), a Graduate Certificate in Spiritual Direction (2015), and has been offering spiritual direction for seven years.

Spiritual direction with Tamara is different from other helping ministries such as counseling, life-coaching/mentoring, or teaching. In spiritual direction the sole purpose is to grow in relationship with God while the Holy Spirit guides us in God's wisdom. The person coming to spiritual direction, the directee, shares about her/his life experiences and in doing so reflects upon God's presence through it all. Together we discern how the Holy Spirit is calling the directee to respond to God's grace and abundant love.

All spiritual direction is confidential and respectful of safe and sacred boundaries. Individual spiritual direction sessions are paced about one month apart for an hour at a time and take place at St. Philip's Catholic Church. For group spiritual direction, individuals rotate through direction each month while the group listens silently and prays for the person receiving direction. The directee or group coordinator will schedule an appointment and pay a \$50 fee in return for the time offered by the director.
