Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

It would be fair to say that we all sometimes wonder when we see someone act in a certain way, "Don't they know that's not right?" Or, "Why didn't they know better?" We witness so many actions and decisions that are quite contrary to what we expect of people, or that go against what we know to be right and wrong.

Our catechism says, "*Every institution is inspired, at least implicitly, by a vision of man and his destiny, from which it derives the point of reference for its judgment, its hierarchy of values, its line of conduct*" (CC 2244). We have rules and laws for living properly in the world. But these are external rules and don't form us as Christians. They show *some* things, but it's from God that we learn how to act properly in the world. God's instructions show us how we can be at our best.

In this weekend's Gospel from Luke, we hear Jesus' words ... guiding us. The beatitudes are central to Jesus' preaching. We're told to love our enemies *and* our neighbor. Jesus' teaching on love is the heart of the sermon. This love is characterized by forgiveness and generosity ... characteristic of our Christian life. They offer us hope, especially when we're caught in the middle of trials and tests. They show us what's already ours by virtue of our salvation through Christ. They help us to see the richness of our lives as God has designed it. Again, from our catechism, "*The Beatitudes respond to the natural desire for happiness. This desire is of divine origin: God has placed it in the human heart in order to draw man to the One who alone can fulfill it*" (CC 1718).

Just like there are consequences when we disobey rules and laws in society, so, too, there are consequences when we wander away from God's vision of human happiness. After he describes the beatitudes, Luke gives four "woes". These "woes" remind us of the Old Testament prophet's cries of impending doom. Luke depicts Jesus as fulfilling the same prophetic role to warn that disaster afflicts those whose worldly comfort and prosperity has turned them away from God and fidelity to the demands of God's covenant. The woes remind us that satisfaction in earthly fame and fortune can give us a false sense of security and cause us to overlook dependence on God's mercy.

Today, we must pay attention to God's warnings about the dangers of a life lived outside His grace, and follow the path of blessing and salvation He laid down for us in the beatitudes.

Planned Parenthood releases new report on nationwide activities:

The Planned Parenthood Federation of America released its latest (2017/18) Annual Report in January. **It shows that PP performed 332,757 abortions nationwide in 2017, an increase of more than 10,000 over the previous year**, even as the group provided fewer non-abortion services like contraception and cancer screenings.

Planned Parenthood also took in a record \$1.665 billion in revenue—including \$563.8 million from the government—in the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018. **Planned Parenthood ended the fiscal year with \$244.8 million in “excess of revenue over expenses.”**

In early January, responding to the idea that PP might pay more attention to non-abortion services in the future, the group’s new president, Leana Wen, clarified what PP is all about. **“Our core mission is providing, protecting and expanding access to abortion and reproductive health care,”** she tweeted. – *MCCL (Minnesota Citizens Concerned for Life) News*; Vol. 49, No. 1 - January – March 2019
