February 24, 2019

Our Responsorial Psalm tells us the Lord is Kind and Merciful... We know God loves us, but we do not always believe it. We consider ourselves unworthy. In meditating about Lent (just around the corner), I wondered about what we can do differently or how we can improve our relationships with others especially having Holy, Happy, Healthy relationships with those God has placed around us.

A recent article by Lauren Katulka talks about relationships with children but I think it applies to all relationships.

- She suggests asking a person: How did you do? Rather than telling them: you know that hurt your brother/sister... a great way to encourage self-reflection...
- When someone lacks confidence, we can support them with a comment like: I believe in you and I believe you can do it...
- You worked so hard: lets someone know effort is important.
- What do you think? Simply puts the other in a position to form an opinion and share it. Sometimes we need to further develop critical thinking skills, and this is a great start, and they take responsibility for their thoughts and actions.
- You did a great job. Praising someone helps, as long as we do not overdo it.
- I am proud of you because... This can cover so many areas: hard work, accomplishments, but also patience, kindness, loving heart...
- How would you improve it? Once again allowing the critical thinking to set in and the desire to improve and perform better.
- Tough question: Are you willing to do what it takes to improve it? What if they have a great idea for improvement but lack the motivation, their heart is in another interest. This question also promotes honesty, important to living a life that is Holy.
- What are the consequences of that choice? Promotes forethought and consideration of the positive and negative consequences. Great wisdom in making the choices we do.
- You make me smile. This alone can bring joy. It generates smiles and positive feelings.
- Telling someone they are worthy of respect, love and success is a wonderful way to rein force self-worth.
- So, we learn we do not have to deal with things alone... ask the question: Would you like to talk about it? This means we need to be a good listener and not always try to "fix" the situation. We allow for thought and growth.
- You make me smile... is a great way to bring joy and to engage in positive behaviors.
- You can come to me anytime and for anything. These simple words encourage others to come in times of distress, emotions and need. We need to give the courage to come forward and share.
- Most Important... Most Important... are the words: I LOVE YOU. Letting others know of love, opens so many doors and leads to Holy Happy Healthy lives.

We know God loves us, but we often feel unworthy. When we use some of the actions described above we can become the hands, and words of God reinforcing Holy, Happy Healthy relationships. Maybe, maybe, you can add one or two of these suggestions to your Lenten journey. Make someone's life better by letting them know: Jesus loves you and so do I...
