The 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of Lent 2019,

**March 10, 2019**

Prayer, fasting and the giving of alms. Three important disciplines of our faith life, especially during Lent. In our Gospel reading from Ash Wednesday we were reminded of the importance of these. And of the fact that we are not supposed to do them for show, but do them because they are the right thing to do! Do them in private, when only you and God will know. We are not to look for big accolades from our peers, or for recognition from this world, but to do the good that we do out of a true desire to do good. And our God who sees in private will notice and will repay with what is truly important!

I encourage you to make a concerted effort this Lent to grow in faith, grow in your relationship with Jesus, through prayer, fasting and almsgiving. There are many options open to you that can aid you in this journey. Make use of the little black books and invest a little extra time in prayer each day. Take part in *The Proclamation*, a weekly series that will help us gain a clearer understanding of who we are, what sin does to us, who Jesus is and what Jesus does for us. There are also bible study opportunities which you are invited to check out.

There are also many opportunities for you to be of service to others during this season of Lent. There will be four Friday evening Fish Fry Dinners starting March 22<sup>nd</sup> and running through April 12<sup>th</sup>. Volunteer to help with one of the many tasks involved in making these dinners possible. Assistance is also needed to prepare and serve the lunches after our 12:10 Masses on Tuesdays during Lent. Our Faith in Our Future Capital Campaign is ongoing, and volunteers are important to the success of the campaign.

And, not to forget alms giving. Sharing of our financial resources is important as well. The use of our Community Outreach envelopes, (the white envelopes in your packet) provides needed assistance to local organizations such as the food shelf and Churches United, as well as others.

I also want to encourage you to make a pledge to our Faith in Our Future Capital Campaign. We are making great progress toward our goal. This campaign will provide the funds needed to provide classrooms/meeting rooms for our school and parish, purchase needed additional property and enhance our cemetery.

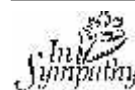

**FoodShare Month is Here**

It's the time when Food Shelves raise money to replenish their inventory to alleviate food insecurity in their communities. Statistics show how well the Bemidji Community Food Shelf (BCFS) is serving the area.

- 3000, households received food last year.
- 398,600, estimated number of meals selected by families and individuals.
- 1.5 million, the number of meals provided to individual children, adults and senior citizens.

Of the more than 330 Food Shelves across Minnesota, Bemidji's was the 15th busiest for users of its services. Consider these facts:

- Bemidji is the 71st largest city in the state.
- The Bemidji School District, which is the area covered by the BCFS, is the 37th largest.

It's obvious the local Food Shelf assists more people than many larger facilities.

The strain on resources was evident. At some time during the past 12 months, the BCFS ran out of breakfast cereal, sliced bread, fresh potatoes, pancake mix, flour, concentrated juice and other items.

Food donations always help, but two-thirds of distributed items are purchased. This year's FoodShare drive runs now through April 7 with funds partially matched by the Greater Minneapolis Council of Churches, which last year gave \$10,000 to the BCFS.

Parishioners have two weekends to help. The St. Philip's Giving House will be available in the narthex for collecting donations during masses on March 16-17 and March 23-24.

To increase the impact of your generosity, the local Knights of Columbus have pledged to match the first \$500 raised and four anonymous parishioners have pledged to match each subsequent \$500 level of donations. As a result, \$2,500 donated during the weekends will actually result in a total of \$5,000 being made available to the BCFS.

Just remember that for every dollar you add to the Giving House, Jesus was speaking to you when he said, *"For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink . . ."* Matthew 25:35

### **Prepare yourself for Lent**

Something for your calendars: Lent is always a great time for us to enter into the story of salvation in a deeper way. This Lent, I want to help everyone do that. I'm going to be hosting a five-part series called **The Proclamation** on the first five Mondays of Lent. It's going to be a great time for all of us to gain a clearer understanding of who we are, what sin does to us, who Jesus is, what Jesus does for us, and how we can respond to him. In this series, we will get back to the foundational elements of the Christian message. By the end of the series, you will (hopefully) be able to communicate the power of the Gospel to those around you. **The series will take place in the Social Hall at St. Philip's on March 11, 18, 25, April 1 & 8.** There are two time options to choose from: either 9:30 to 10:30 AM or 7:00 to 8:00 PM. It is not necessary to pre-register for this series. I hope to see you there! ~Fr. Bryan

### **Spiritual Direction Available at St. Philip's**

Spiritual direction is a ministry of prayerful, contemplative listening offered to another within a confidential one-on-one or a small group setting.

This ministry is especially helpful for people who are seeking the following:

- To know and understand God's call—growing in discernment.
- To recognize God at the center of all things.
- A deeper prayer life, one that yields real intimacy in relationship with Jesus Christ.

Our Spiritual Director, Tamara Moore, is a Catholic laywoman in good standing with the Church. She is married with four children, has earned a Master's degree in Theology (2005), a Graduate Certificate in Spiritual Direction (2015), and has been offering spiritual direction for seven years.

Spiritual direction with Tamara is different from other helping ministries such as counseling, life-coaching/mentoring, or teaching. In spiritual direction the sole purpose is to grow in relationship with God while the Holy Spirit guides us in God's wisdom. The person coming to spiritual direction, the directee, shares about her/his life experiences and in doing so reflects upon God's presence through it all. Together we discern how the Holy Spirit is calling the directee to respond to God's grace and abundant love.

All spiritual direction is confidential and respectful of safe and sacred boundaries. Individual spiritual direction sessions are paced about one month apart for an hour at a time and take place at St. Philip's Catholic Church. For group spiritual direction, individuals rotate through direction each month while the group listens silently and prays for the person receiving direction. The directee or group coordinator will schedule an appointment and pay a \$50 fee in return for the time offered by the director.
