Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

March 17, 2019

One of the chief traits of Jesus' life is His commitment to prayer. At every special moment from His baptism to His death, Jesus shows himself to be a man of prayer. We're all called to be people of prayer, and Lent is a good time for us to reexamine our prayer life.

Like all relationships, our relationship with God requires time and effort ... time to talk, share our lives and get to know Him in all His glory and life-changing power. Yet, not only does God want us to share our needs with Him as we pray, but He also wants us to pause and listen carefully to His word.

As we think of this, we hear this weekend's Lukan narrative of the transfiguration. At first glance, it might seem like a strange reading for Lent: why not a Gospel reading on healing or mercy? But this selection isn't an arbitrary one; I think it was chosen to inspire and assure us as we begin our Lenten journey ... to remind us that by our commitment and practices, we hope to share in God's glory ... that Glory we receive a glimpse of at the mountain-top. Our practices in Lent by themselves don't have much meaning if they don't have this *greater* meaning; indeed, our entire season of Lent has little purpose if, in the end, it doesn't bring us to the glory of Easter.

Luke's narrative mirrors the other synoptic Gospels of Matthew and Mark: Jesus leads his disciples up the mountain to pray. Suddenly, they experience something new as the glory of God bursts through His humanity, and the prophets Moses and Elijah appear talking with him. These prophets were also men who hiked-up mountains during difficult times, to find prayerful peace at their heights. Once there, they encountered God as they prayed, and became renewed and strengthened in their missions.

As he saw Jesus' glory, Peter is distressed, and as oftentimes happens when we experience something new and unsettling, Peter falls back onto something familiar and less threatening. His idea to set-up three tents shows how much he still must learn about our Lord. Then, as this is all happening, a cloud covers the mountaintop, and from it, we hear the Father's voice: "*This is my chosen Son, listen to him.*" Here's the real purpose behind God's visible manifestation: Jesus is much more than just another prophet, He is the *Chosen Son of God*. These are the words that we all must hear and accept if *we* want to be transformed and changed.

When our world is sometimes dark and sinful, we need to remember God's words at the mountaintop. *We* need to be willing to hike-up the mountain and experience God's glory. Jesus is revealed as the one who comes to us on God's behalf, and He's the One worthy of our attention and obedience.

This Lenten Season should reveal a "transfiguration" in our hearts. For just as Peter said, "*it is good that we are here*", it's surely good when we can pray and celebrate God together as community, because it's only when we are in the Lord's presence that we can be open to His word and to the glory He desires and longs to share with us.

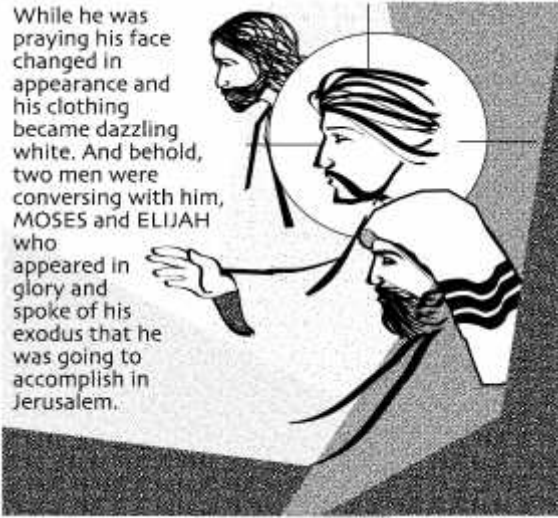

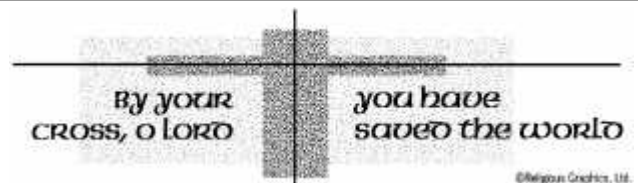
