### Liturgy: The Antidote to the Addiction of Technology?

March 24, 2019

Studies show that the average American adult will spend more than eleven hours interacting with media, while teens spend an average of nine hours. (TIME FLIES: U.S. ADULTS NOW SPEND NEARLY HALF A DAY INTERACTING WITH MEDIA, 2018) The use of this technology is starting to have an adverse effect on our modern lives. People now have addictions surrounding excessive gaming, as well as compulsive checking of social media, news, and emails. Technology has brought a lot of good, but has also brought distraction and increased mental health issues.

I wish I could say that I am beyond the grips of technology addiction; but alas, I think I am right there with everyone struggling to untether technology. For Lent I committed to reducing smartphone usage. So I promptly downloaded an app (yes, more technology) that would assess how I was spending my time. I was appalled when assessing my usage. I couldn't believe how often I check my phone, how often I scrolled through meaningless headlines. More concerning, I wonder what the phone is doing to my relationships and my spiritual life. The urge to check the phone happens while visiting family, playing with the kids, during dinner and even in prayer. Are we becoming mindless cogs in the machine of technology, tuning out the world around us? How could we possibly feel the presence of God's love when we can't stop checking our phone?

I would like to use the liturgy as an antidote to this difficulty. The liturgy is our faith life's center of gravity. We gather together with those who share our beliefs and offer our community prayers to heaven. We sing together, hear the word of God proclaimed, and share in the ritual of the Eucharist where the Divine meets earth. This is all counter to the wired world around us. Here we learn to temper and focus our busy brains and channel them towards God. We sit, kneel, and stand, disciplining our overworked minds to enter the transcendent. The fulfillment that we look for in technology - connection, productivity, and progress - can be found in a better way in our participation in the liturgy. "The individual—provided that he actually desires to take part in the celebration of the liturgy—must realize that it is as a member of the Church that he, and the Church within him, acts and prays; he must know that in this higher unity he is at one with the rest of the faithful, and he must desire to be so." (Romano Guardini, *The Spirit of the Liturgy*).

Could it be the antidote to our technological obsessions, the desire to be loved, wanted, cared for, the dopamine rush of empty 'likes' could be in the simplicity of our quiet ritual? Disconnect from the wired world and enter this Lent by using Mass as the medicinal response to our technological obsession. In the liturgy, man is no longer concerned with himself; his gaze is directed towards God. In it, man is not so much intended to edify himself as to contemplate God's majesty. The liturgy means that the soul exists in God's presence, originates in Him, lives in a world of divine realities, truths, mysteries, and symbols, and really lives its true, characteristic, and fruitful life." (Romano Guardini, *The Spirit of the Liturgy*) If the wifi is the tool to connect us to the internet ... perhaps we should use the liturgy to connect us to our faith? If the internet can give us such a vast amount of information, can you imagine what God will give us through the liturgy?

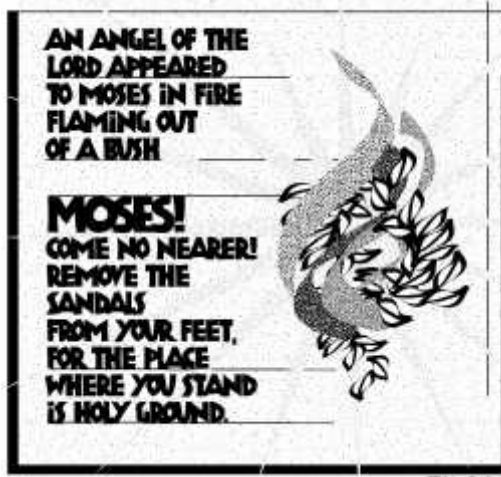
