The Father's Embrace

March 31, 2019

The Parable of the Prodigal Son is a story of rules, rebellion, repentance, and, above all, love and mercy. As we heard in the Gospel, the younger of two sons rebels against his father and demands his inheritance before it is rightfully owed to him. His father grants his wish but soon after, the Prodigal Son exhausts the entirety of his inheritance on worldly pursuits. His extravagant and wasteful spending leaves him poor and destitute. Soon after, a famine strikes the land and the Prodigal Son becomes so hungry that he begins to envy the food that pigs eat. Then, something remarkable happens. He repents and returns to his father showing sincere contrition and humility. What's truly special about this moment is the embrace of the father, who sees his son from far off, suggesting that he had eagerly and hopefully awaited his son's return.

The father calls for celebration, but the older son, hearing of his younger brother's return, becomes jealous and angry. He who had always acted accordingly and had never disobeyed his father had never been rewarded like his rebellious and prideful younger brother. The father's message to his older son is important for each of us to remember. Mercy must always out rule anger. Let us not be like the pharisees who condescend and judge the lives of others. Instead, let us welcome those who have died but are alive again, and celebrate their return.

I want to take a moment, too, to talk about the *Faith in Our Future Capital Campaign*. I am humbled and thankful for the generosity we have seen so far from our faith community. St. Philip's is blessed to have such a strong community of faith. Because of the generosity and faith of our parish and school, the greater Bemidji community can turn to St. Philip's for spiritual, educational, and material support. Together, we are a beacon of Christ's love and a pillar of educational excellence within Bemidji.

Our capital campaign will strengthen St. Philip's apostolic impact on our growing community and ensure that its ministry will continue long into the future. While we have made tremendous progress toward our \$2.45 million campaign goal, we must rally together to push St. Philip's across the finish line. **Our plan is to end active fundraising by April 5th, only one week away**, so that we can return our focus to the liturgy and ministry central to our worship.

This campaign relies on the sacrifice of the entire faith community. Please, if you have not yet made your pledge, I urge you to join your fellow parishioners and consider the many gifts that God has granted you throughout your life and what St. Philip's has meant to you and your family. We need the help of each member to reach our campaign goal and fortify the foundation for a bright future at St. Philips. No gift is too great or too small—all we ask is that you consider what a gift a sacrifice means for you. Let us not waste our gifts like the Prodigal Son. Instead, let us offer them to the Father in thanksgiving for his love and mercy.
