Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Jesus' peace liberates us from our prison of fear.

In this Sunday's Mass readings, we see fear contrasted with confidence. In the first reading, even though the Apostles were performing signs and wonders, there were still some who were unable to join them as believers, even though many others were confidently added to the number of believers. A similar fear was evident in the seven Asian churches (*in the reading from Revelation*). Here, when John recognizes the distress brought on by their fears, he is able to speak with confidence about his own testimony and imprisonment on Patmos.

John received confidence from his encounter with the risen Jesus in today's Gospel. We hear at this encounter the greeting from Jesus, "Peace be with you." Not only was this greeting a wish or a hope, but it is also a statement. It's not meant to say "may peace be with you." It means "peace *is with you*." The actual and immediate impact of Jesus' presence and words is shown in the disciple's "rejoicing." And for this reason, John and his fellow Apostles now have confidence that Jesus' peace will abide with them, and give them the strength to work through any fears they may encounter.

Thomas wasn't with the others when Jesus appeared the first time, and he can't bring himself to believe their testimony. While we don't know the exact reason Thomas wasn't present with the Apostles when Jesus came, and we don't know why he doesn't believe what he was told, we do know what happens when Jesus appears again.

This time, Thomas *is* present and he affirms his belief in the Resurrection after he touches Jesus' wounds. But, before Jesus invited Thomas to touch his wounds, he greeted him with, Peace be with you. Again, this simple phrase, as it did for the other Apostles, inspired within Thomas a sense of confidence that would ultimately lead him to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ to the world.

All of us face encounters, events and people that can produce distress and leave us in a state of fear. But what we learn from Thomas, John, Peter and the other disciples, is that Jesus came to free us from the spiritual and emotional prison that our fears put us into. Our Lord Jesus Christ calls us to embrace the peace He offers us, and to join with the other believers, who walk with the confidence that comes from knowing that the peace of Jesus allays any of our fears. Jesus wants for us to enjoy His peace. We should always remember our Lord Jesus Christ's words when he appeared to St. Faustina and said to her, "My child, life on earth is a struggle indeed; a great struggle for My kingdom. But fear not, because you are not alone."

# FIVE WAYS

to protect your children from sexual abuse

*Parents play the primary role in educating their children about sexual abuse. Here are 5 tips for teaching safety to the little ones God has entrusted to you.*

1

**Keep it practical.** Teach your children the differences between safe touches and unsafe touches.

2

**Tell your children that saying "no" is okay.** Empower your children to say "no" if anyone makes them feel uncomfortable or touches them inappropriately.

3

**Give your children a way to alert you.** Tell your children they can use an excuse or share a special "code-word" with you to alert you about an unsafe person or situation.

4

**Tell your children to report an unsafe touch.**

Let your children know they should tell you if they feel uncomfortable or unsafe around any adult or peer. You can also identify other adults they can tell about unsafe touches.

5

**Tell your children you trust them.** If your child makes a report to you, believe him or her. Tell them it is not their fault and that you love them. Immediately bring the allegation to the attention of public authorities.
