Music in Liturgy: A Window to Christ by Aana Freihammer

May 26, 2019

Since high school, I have had the joy of working with music in liturgy. This opportunity introduced me to the fascinating tradition of the liturgy, and the wonderful diversity of the human church. The complexity of why some Masses are prayed well, and others not prayed well become the ongoing challenge for me as I continue to serve a Liturgy and Music Director.

In high school, I remember playing in a praise band and at a high school church retreat. We were sounding great, rocking out, and I was really in awe of the beautiful music and how it stirred emotional connection to God. After the retreat, I was shocked to find out that my friends hated the music, they felt the music was contrived, and they wanted just normal 'hymns' at the retreat. I was surprised and hurt. I couldn't believe that my friends didn't have the same prayerful experience. Fast forward several years into my music and liturgy studies and I began implementing chant into liturgy at the parish I assisted. I assumed if I sang the chant well, the congregation would immediately fall in love with the ethereal and ancient sounds. On the contrary, several dedicated church goers candidly admitted that they had a hard time praying with the chant. This threw me into the deep end of sorting complex questions: 'Is there a correct musical style for liturgy? Does the Church have a preference? What happens if someone doesn't care for the style of music that is being used in liturgy?' The fruits of these challenging questions deepened my understanding of both liturgy and the compassion for our diverse Church family at prayer.

Liturgical music and art have a very delicate role to play in the liturgy. The Church really sees chant as pride of place but admits other styles of music as long as the style facilitates participation in the ritual: 'Therefore sacred music is to be considered the more holy in proportion as it is more closely connected with the liturgical action, whether it adds delight to prayer, fosters unity of minds, or confers greater solemnity upon the sacred rites (*Sacrosanctum Concilium*, para. 112) If you have ever been in one of my choirs, I teach first that liturgical music is a window to Christ. Everything that we do in liturgical music or liturgical arts needs to be transparent as we draw people into the ritual. This is easier said than done. Even a beautiful piece of art in liturgy could become a distraction to the ritual.

When the Church doesn't readily use a style of music or cannot use a style of music it is probably for three reasons. One, the Church just isn't sure that the style of music works in liturgy yet, as the Church tends to use things that work well over a long period of time and avoids 'trendy or pioneering'. Two, the local church is not sure that it can be done well with its current resources (i.e. a praise band in a Baroque Cathedral would probably not turn out well). Third, the Church does not feel that the style of music can lift the congregation into the ritual action of the liturgy. Music can do lots of things- draw a person into prayer, connect the person emotionally, connect a person to other people, but may not always draw a person into the liturgy.

In the end this is probably more information that you wanted to know- but learning more about the music in the liturgy can speak more deeply about what we do every Sunday. So, if you find that a song or style of music does not reach you, or the music does not readily draw you into prayer, I encourage you to stick with the prayer of the liturgy beyond the moment. This is also an opportunity to learn more about yourself, the community, and what the Church says about liturgy. *Why do I like/dislike that style of music? What does that say about me, and my musical experiences, or my prayer life? Does the Church prefer this style of music for some reason? Is this reaching someone else in the community? What 'fosters delight in prayer and unites' to the ritual?*

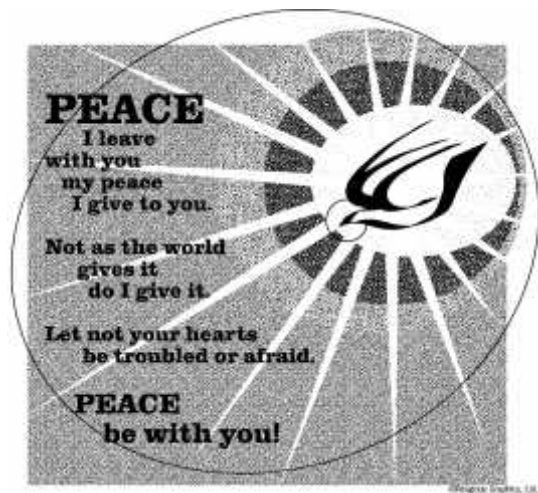

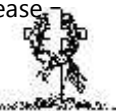
