Happy "Ascension Sunday"!

June 2, 2019

Those who are aware of the traditional understanding of the Ascension will catch the irony in the phrase - it should never be called Ascension Sunday. The Bible tells us that Jesus ascended into Heaven forty days after his Resurrection (Acts 1:3), which would have been this past Thursday. It's only fairly recent that most dioceses in the United States began celebrating the Ascension on a Sunday, so as to remove an extra Holy Day of Obligation. There are still six provinces in the country that keep the celebration of the Ascension on the fortieth day of Easter, but we are not in them so we honor the Ascension this weekend. For us this year, we have a jam-packed June, filled with all kinds of holy feasts and solemnities of the Lord. It's a very exciting month with all kinds of opportunities to learn about the rich traditions and doctrines of our faith. What a gift!

Of course, we have the **Ascension** this weekend, when we recall that Jesus has gone before us to the Father to open the gates of Heaven for us to enter in. All that's left for us to do is remain faithful to the Lord by keeping his commandments and trusting in his divine will. Next weekend we celebrate the great **Solemnity of Pentecost**, the day the Holy Spirit was given to the Church on the fiftieth day after the Resurrection. It was on this day that the Church sprang forth from the Upper Room, no longer afraid and no longer living only for themselves, but now bold and sacrificially generous in the way they lived and spoke about the Lord Jesus. Powerful! The following week leads us back into Ordinary Time until Advent. However, we have two more Sundays of glorious solemnities.

On the 16th of this month, we celebrate the **Solemnity of The Most Holy Trinity**. While we always remember that our God is three persons, it is on this day that we take a closer look to examine what that means. On the following Sunday, the 23rd, we celebrate the **Solemnity of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ**, commonly called Corpus Christi (which is Latin for Body of Christ). It's on this great solemnity that we emphasize even more strongly that Jesus Christ is really present in Holy Communion - Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity - not as a mere sign or symbol, but his real body and real blood are present to us, so that we may fulfill his command to eat and drink his flesh and blood. Check out John 6 for more information.

The final week of June gives us three more great solemnities. First, on Monday, the 24th, we have the **Solemnity of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist**, that great precursor of the Lord. He is a sign for us that the Lord fulfills all of his promises. Then on Friday, the 28th, we have the **Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus**. The image of the Sacred Heart is one of the great images in our tradition. Do a Google search to find some images and spend some time reflecting on all that you see. Finally, on Saturday, the 29th, we have the **Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul**, those two great Apostles of Jesus Christ. They did so much to win the world over to the open Heart of the Savior. Wow, what a glory-packed month! Can you believe so many people begin to take the summer "off" from the faith?? They are missing out on so much! Let's receive all of the grace available to us and then go out and invite the world into the great beauty of our faith.

May the Lord give you his peace!

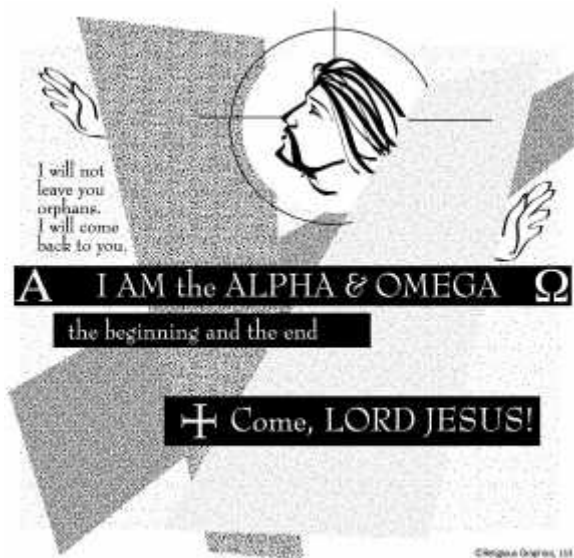

Regulations Concerning Grave Decorations at Holy Cross Cemetery:

1. Cemetery personnel are not responsible for decorations placed on gravesites.
2. Artificial wreathes may be placed on grave sites during the winter months (Oct 15 to May 1), if erected on a secure stand or easel.
3. It is permissible to place cut flowers on a gravesite provided they are on a grave marker in a container that is not easily blown over or broken. Fresh flowers placed on graves will be removed when wilted.
4. Potted or boxed plants on gravesites must be stable enough for outdoor use and be placed on the grave marker. They shall not be placed around the marker. When wilted, they will be removed and destroyed by cemetery employees.
5. Shepherd hooks may be installed by drilling them into the concrete border of the marker so as not to interfere with the mowing of the grass.
6. Planting trees, shrubs, bushes, flowers and cutting, watering or fertilizing of any grave area may be done only with the permission of cemetery employees.
7. Items placed on graves to mark a birthday or anniversary need to be removed within 10 days after placement. This allows staff to keep the grounds mowed and tended to.
8. Decorations may be placed on gravesites 3 days prior to Memorial Day and then removed within 10 days after Memorial Day.
9. Decorations placed outside this time frame will be removed by cemetery personnel to allow for the proper maintenance of cemetery grounds.

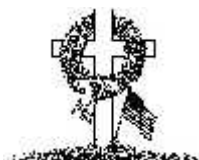
