Liturgy: Get Ready for the Hard Work by Aana Freihammer

June 23, 2019

I am blessed to come from very hard-working families. My parents both grew up on farms. With nine kids in each family, everyone learned to work hard from a young age to make sure there was enough food on the table. Growing up, whenever you would hear some type of shenanigans or mischief in the neighborhood, my dad would respond, "sounds like someone needs to get a bigger lawn." It seemed that the answer to so many of society's ails, from my family's perspective, was to get out there and dig, rake, shovel, scrub!

Our culture often thinks of work as something to be avoided or - at best - something to endure. The only value of work from a secular perspective is to achieve wealth, prestige, and success. As a result, work becomes a frustrating infringement on the relaxing things we would rather do. However, the Church views work very differently; valuing the experience as something that makes us closer to who we are as humans and draws us closer to God. In Genesis, God gave Adam and Eve the command to "be fruitful and multiply, to fill the earth and subdue it" (Genesis 1:28). St. John Paul II wrote a profound letter entitled *Laborem Exercens* (Through Work) in 1981 to further expound on the Church's view of the dignity of work. In the letter St John Paul II further articulates this theology: "Man is the image of God partly through the mandate received from his Creator to subdue, to dominate, the earth. In carrying out this mandate, man, every human being, reflects the very action of the Creator of the universe" (Chapter II, para 4). You've probably experienced this wonderful 'gift' of work-- maybe after weeding your garden, mowing the lawn, cleaning the house, quilting, swimming laps in the lake, jogging, doing dishes, or cooking a meal. This work is beautiful, satisfying, even therapeutic as your task engages every aspect of your body and intellect. At times you may have experienced even the ethereal sense of being in the 'zone' where nothing matters except full immersion in the task. These experiences are glimpses into heaven. We might dread some tasks at first, but when you've finished the task you feel so much more human and complete.

Liturgy comes from the Greek word for 'work of the people'. This translation seems to imply that the liturgy is dependent on our work, instead of God's. However, the Catechism addresses this by stating the liturgy is the work of the entire body of Christ (*CCC 1136*). The presider offers the sacrifice of the Eucharist on behalf of the people, and it is through God's grace that we, the people, receive the grace of this redemptive act. Our 'work' comes in when we fully participate in offering the sacrifice. Vatican II coined the term "active participation" regarding our role in the liturgy, which illustrates that we are not just bystanders in this sacrifice. The expectation is we are working in this ritual as well. We are offering everything we are through our actions, thoughts, and words. Liturgy is a unique form of prayer where we do not just sit and receive, but also respond back with grace and participate in the actions of the liturgy. It is easy to come into liturgy and think, 'I am not getting anything out of this.' This could be because we are expecting the liturgy to be more like a TV show where the experience comes to us and we assess the success of the show by how much the entertainment moved us. Instead, to fully appreciate the liturgy, we are supposed to be right there in the game - head-to-head engaging in every aspect of the ritual with every aspect of ourselves. This is the 'hard work' we are called to do. Don't be afraid to dive in- the full experience of humanity and glimpses of divinity awaits!

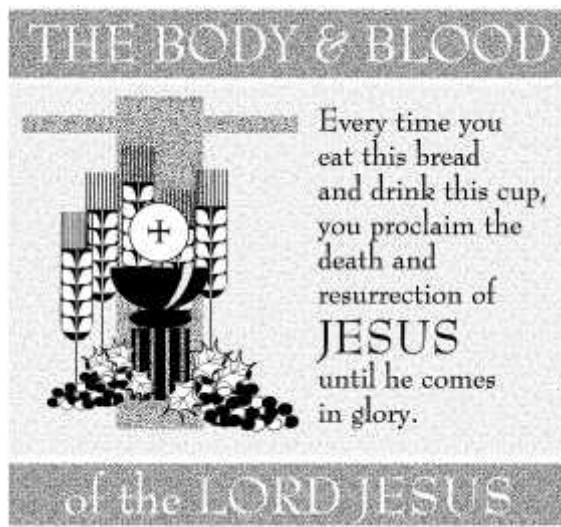
