Martha or Mary ... or Maybe Both!

July 21, 2019

A Sunday Mass story: Once upon a time, a young mother with three young children found a pew toward the back of the Church. She regularly did this so that she could make a quick and graceful exit if one of her kids needed the bathroom or started to squirm or be noisy. A few minutes later, an older parishioner came up to the young mother and announced that "you're sitting in my seat." The young mother moved her family over, knowing her "escape route" had now been compromised.

Almost as if on cue, when the first reading began, one of the children started crying. The older parishioner who forced her way into "her pew" started glaring at the young mother. Thankfully, another older parishioner, sitting right behind the mother, leaned forward and quietly offered to watch the two other children while the mother took care of the one who needed her attention.

So, the debate between the Martha and Mary approach continues: should we do what is most important in the right moment; do we listen to Jesus or tend to His needs? In the above Mass story, one older parishioner wants to sit at the feet of Jesus and hear what He has to say without being disturbed. The other parishioner seems more concerned with meeting the needs of a distraught mother. And, in this particular case, we might say that the parishioner who came to the aid of the mother did so because she already knew what Jesus had taught, and she acted on it.

As a Church, we must never stop working to make sure that anyone and everyone are welcome in our midst, regardless of what their circumstances are. We are blessed by a God who loves us beyond words. Let us share that love with others by ensuring that we use both the talents of Martha and Mary within our Church so that we can bring them to Christ ... to the Lord's Table and the Eucharist.

If we grow complacent in our responsibility of not only *hearing the word of God*, but also in *acting upon it*, our Church will suffer. Let none of us be responsible for turning away anyone who comes to our doors seeking Christ. *Let us hear* with urgency God's word spoken here and *let us act* upon that word by reaching out to everyone who comes to our Church. We can be both Martha *and* Mary at the same time.

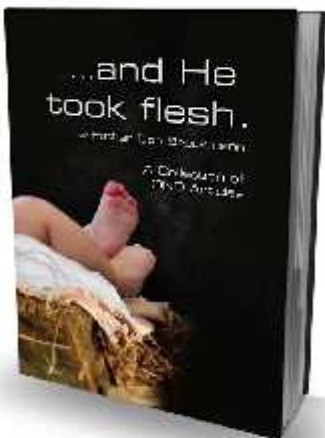

We live in a world that does not easily embrace this concept—the call to wait. With greater technological advancement, the ability to access information often occurs in seconds. We have fast food, fast communication, fast shopping, shipping—which seems to bring satisfaction to our everyday lives. But has it? What has been the cost both personally and more importantly, spiritually?

We have become an impatient, even rude people. These advances tend to drive us deeper into selfishness and have at times completely removed our personal contact with one another. How frequently do we engage in meaningful dialogue—genuinely enjoying one another's presence? How often do we see families sitting at the table having dinner together (without TV, cell phones...)? Is God even present on a regular basis in our day?

Days rush by so quickly that I find myself wishing life would slow down. We are in such a hurry that 'time' runs our very lives. The gift of waiting and anticipation and a life that allows us a bit of silence is disappearing. Discovering a simpler more peaceful way is a rarity.

God fashioned time and seasons in order to teach us lessons, one of which is the concept of waiting. There is a period of the ordinary before the extraordinary. There is a time to rest so that we can reflect on the goodness all around us. And as we rest we can embrace the gift of waiting with patience and acceptance. As we wait, there is a knowing, somethings cannot be rushed in the way we are used to.

This waiting creates a longing for something special; it stirs in us a desire for something more. There is a spirit of beauty and goodness, opening our hearts, expanding us to give more of ourselves to one another and our Creator. And so we wait — with expectancy.

Dear Christ's Faithful of the Diocese of Crookston,

I am happy to report to you that a Settlement Agreement has been reached between the victims and survivors of clergy sexual abuse and the Diocese of Crookston. This Agreement has been reached after years of negotiation and mediation regarding suits filed against the Diocese between April of 2016 and May of 2017. These suits were filed as a result of the passage of the Minnesota Child Victims Act which lifted the statute of limitations for sexual abuse cases in Minnesota, opening a three-year window allowing victims to come forward and affording them the opportunity to file civil claims. This Agreement settles all cases against the Diocese – 15 in total – as well as cases brought against eight parishes of the Diocese filed in conjunction with the cases against the Diocese.

The monetary figure agreed upon in the Settlement Agreement is \$5,000,000. Most of this has been paid by our insurance carriers. \$1,550,000 is being paid by the Diocese of Crookston from funds saved from the sale of property (2016 and 2018), from non-restricted estate gifts (2017), and from funds the Diocese currently has on hand. No Diocesan Annual Appeal funds were used.

To all victims and survivors of sexual abuse by clergy, as the Bishop of Crookston I apologize for the harm done to you by those entrusted with your spiritual care. Although you can never be fully compensated for your suffering, we are thankful this litigation has now come to a good end and are hopeful this settlement offers you justice and will be helpful for healing.

To you, the faithful of this local Church, I say thank you for your continued prayer: for victims of sexual abuse; for a fair resolve to these cases. Let us all now, humbly, offer prayers of thanksgiving. Because of this settlement, the Diocese of Crookston can avoid filing for Chapter 11 bankruptcy protection. All other dioceses in Minnesota have filed or announced their intent to file for financial reorganization. We will not have to lay off staff. We can joyfully and steadfastly continue our mission of bringing the Good News of Jesus Christ to this time and place. We pledge our continued efforts to rid the Church and world of sexual abuse and provide a safe environment for all.
