20th Sunday Ordinary Time Greetings,

When we call ourselves "Catholic" what does it mean in word and action? Are there requirements to being "Catholic"? What might be an important "rule" some chose to follow or not follow? This week I have taken an article by [Annemarie Scobey](#) and paraphrased it.

Why going to Mass is worth the effort?

Getting to Mass on Sundays feels optional to many families. Will anyone even notice? Is there a consequence? Since the very early years of our church, attending Mass was never optional. Today the church teaches that attending Mass is an obligation barring a grave cause for absence (e.g. illness). But why? Shouldn't we go to Mass because we want to, not because we have to?

Our one constant: Weekly Mass grounds a family. Going to Mass every Sunday, no matter what, reminds us that amid all of the uncertainties of life, we give praise and thank God for all the gifts we have been given.

Discipline: When we believe something is beneficial to us, we do it often. Going to Mass each week requires discipline. We may not know exactly the problems we are preventing by spending time listening to God's Word and receiving the Eucharist each week.

Mass is not a self-centered event. It's about praising God and taking part in the meal that reminds us who we are: The Body of Christ. That gives us new energy, nudges us toward becoming a better version of ourselves.

Our gift to our community: Every week we show up at Mass is a week that we say to our community, "We believe". Faith can be contagious. When I see parents with kids younger than mine at Mass, I think to myself - if they can do it, so can I. That inspires me to keep coming.

A great mission: Older children are searching for a guiding principle, a mission worthy of their lives. The church has such a mission for them, to make the world a better place, a place more like the way God would have things. We need a community to accompany us and send us forth, which is exactly what the mass does each week. -

How does a family pull off weekly Mass? Simple: No exceptions. Families that make it to Mass each Sunday often don't ever consider making an exception unless someone is seriously ill. "We will find a Mass wherever our kids are playing sports." Grave cause: When you think you have a reason not to go to Mass, ask yourself, "Is this a grave cause?" Spiritual health: Keep focused on building the spiritual health of your family in the same way you're focused on physical health.

This week you may have received a letter in the mail from the Diocese regarding the DAA. The DAA is one way we connect ourselves with the larger church. Our donations along with the other 65 parishes of the Diocese help cover the expenses funding education for seminarians, the Marriage Tribunal, College Campus Ministry, Continuing Education of Priests and Deacons, and the Office of Safe Environment. So much good work is accomplished by our Diocese and it benefits all of us. We acknowledge we are part of the larger church.

St. Philip's has reached 67% of a \$86,687 goal. Leaving us short by \$28,673. Our participation rate is 17% — If we could reach last year's participation rate, we would be so close...

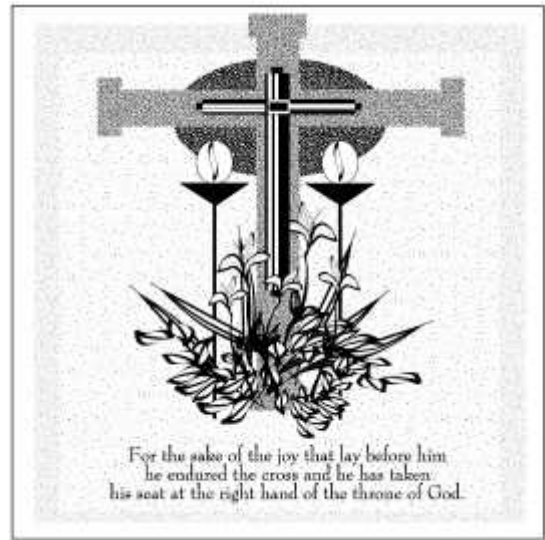
