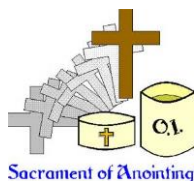

SUNDAY KIDZ

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Twelfth Week of Ordinary Time



Sunday is the **Twelfth Sunday of Ordinary Time**. Jesus tells us not to be afraid and to trust in his love and care for us.

We remember **St. Ireneaus** this week and celebrate the **Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul**.

We begin reading from the **Book of Genesis** for the next four weeks. We begin with the promise to Abram.

In the gospels this week we read the last part of the **Sermon on the Mount** in **Matthew**. In the same way he has before, Jesus calls us deeper. We are not to judge so that we ourselves won't be judged. We are to be fair in treating others if we want to be treated fairly. We have to get the freedom to recognize our own faults before we try to remove others'. We are to care for others, as we would wish to be cared for. Our security will come from building our lives of the solid rock of God's promises to us, rather than on the shifting sands of what the world might promise us. Jesus teaches us how to pray to our common Father.



Daily Prayer This Week

This is a great week to reflect on several wonderful elements of the Word and to let them interact with genuine desires in our hearts - desires that carry over from previous weeks or desires that are just coming to our awareness. We can reflect upon our call - the vocation we find ourselves in, the ways we live it and are faithful to it. We can be comforted by Jesus telling us that fear is what gets in the way of our freedom to be a witness of the Good News for others.

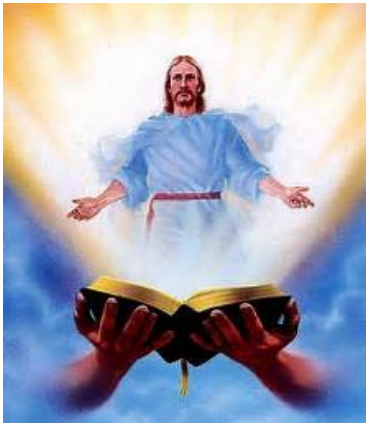
Fear comes in so many forms. Sometimes, when we are angry a lot, or finding ourselves to be more and more defensive, we can trace the anxiety or insecurity back to a particular fear or a general fear. How liberating it can be for us to pray for the grace to be fear-less, especially in the concrete ways that will come to us in our everyday life this week.

And it is good to recognize the traps that sabotage us in our everyday relationships and daily choices. Judging others is an easy trap for people trying to be good. It is so easy for me to notice when you aren't as good as I'm trying to be. The end result is I'm trapped, and fail to recognize my own ways of failing to love. If only we could love others, at least in the same way we crave to be loved! The culture we live in, the way Jesus describes it to us is clearly entering through the "narrow" gate. And, when I don't sort through my various and sometimes conflicting desires, it feels like my life is built upon sand. When the going gets tough, I have nothing to fall back upon. The week ends with a picture of Jesus, the healer.

Perhaps by the end of the week, the brief conversations we have with Jesus, in the midst of our daily life, will reveal desires for healing. Jesus always wants to show us how he can make us whole. He always wants us to be able to receive gifts, which we in turn can share with others. All of us can find grace in some part of the Abraham and Sarah story. Who among us doesn't feel that we are unable, too old, not religious enough, not strong enough, not ready, held back in some way from bringing forth life or fulfilling our vocation? This week is a good reminder that "nothing is impossible with God." Each night this week, we can recall what we've talked about, asked for and received, and we can give thanks.

Sagrado Corazón de Jesús

Símbolo del amor de Cristo

El mes de junio se caracteriza, de modo particular, por la devoción al Sagrado Corazón de Jesús. Celebrar el Corazón de Cristo significa dirigirse hacia el centro íntimo de la persona del Salvador, el centro que la Biblia identifica precisamente con su corazón, sede del amor que ha redimido al mundo.



Si ya el corazón humano representa un misterio insondable que sólo Dios conoce, ¡cuánto más sublime es el Corazón de Jesús, en el que late la vida misma del Verbo! En Él, como sugieren las hermosas letanías del Sagrado Corazón, haciéndose eco de las Escrituras, se encuentran todos los tesoros de la sabiduría y de la ciencia, y toda la plenitud de la divinidad.

Para salvar al hombre, víctima de su misma desobediencia, Dios quiso darle un “**corazón nuevo**”, fiel a su voluntad de amor (cf. Jr 31, 33; Ez 36,26; Sal 50, 12). Este corazón es el Corazón de Cristo, la obra maestra del Espíritu Santo, que comenzó a latir en el seno virginal de María y fue traspasado por la lanza en la Cruz, convirtiéndose de este modo, y para todos, en manantial inagotable de vida eterna. Ese Corazón es ahora prenda de esperanza para todo hombre.

¡Cuán necesario es para la humanidad contemporánea el mensaje que brotó de la contemplación del Corazón de Cristo! En efecto, ¿de dónde, si no es de esa fuente, podrá sacar las reservas de mansedumbre y de perdón necesarias para revolver los duros conflictos que la ensangrientan?

Al Corazón Misericordioso de Jesús quisiera encomendarle hoy de modo especial a cuantos viven en Tierra Santa: judíos, cristianos y musulmanes. Ese Corazón que, colmado de afrentas, no albergó jamás sentimientos de odio y venganza, sino que pidió el perdón para sus asesinos, nos señala el único camino para salir de la espiral de la violencia: el de la pacificación de los ánimos, de la comprensión recíproca y de la reconciliación.

Junto con el Corazón misericordioso de Cristo veneramos el Corazón inmaculado de María Santísima, Mediadora de gracia y de salvación.

A Ella nos dirigimos con confianza ahora para implorar misericordia y paz para la Iglesia y para el mundo entero. (Juan Pablo II. Ángelus. Domingo 23 de junio de 2002)
