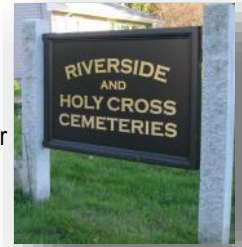

The many titles of Mary are either meant to point out different aspects of who she is (e.g., Mother of God, Blessed Virgin, Immaculata); special intentions for which her prayer intercessions are sought (e.g., Our Lady of Peace, Our Mother of Sorrows); prophetic attributes, or devotional piety (e.g., Morning Star, Tower of Ivory, Star of the Sea, Mystical Rose). The Blessed Mother has many titles and names because of her universal importance to Christians as the Mother of Jesus.

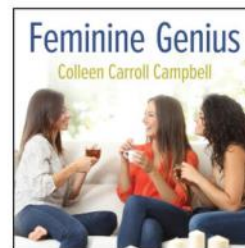

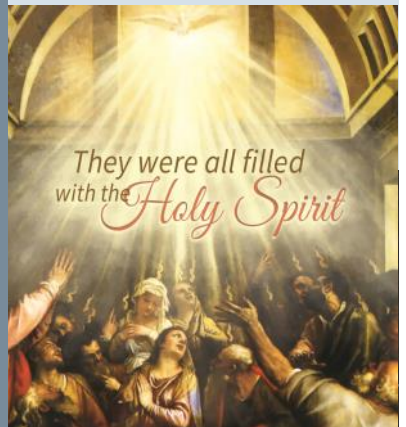
