The Last Supper is amazing in detail, and their gift is truly a great blessing to us. Moreover, they have a wonderful statue of the Sacred Heart of Jesus that will complement the Church of the Sacred Heart. This is something surprisingly missing from the Church over the years. Pope Francis has invited all the faithful in the world to pray the rosary each day in the Marian month of October to join in communion and penitence. In addition, the Holy Father has asked that two prayers be added after the recitation of the rosary, one to the Blessed Mother and one to Saint Michael the Archangel, both asking the Lord to protect the Church from evil.

The Russian mystics and the great saints of all the traditions advised, in moments of spiritual turbulence, to shelter beneath the mantle of the Blessed Mother pronouncing the invocation "Sub tuum praesidium":

"We fly to Thy protection, O Holy Mother of God. Do not despise our petitions in our necessities, but deliver us always from all dangers, O Glorious and Blessed Virgin."

The rosary would conclude with the prayer written by Pope Leo XIII:

"Saint Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle, be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil; may God rebuke him, we humbly pray; and do thou, O Prince of the heavenly host, by the power of God, cast into hell Satan and all the evil spirits who prow through the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen."

THIS WEEK'S THEME: FAITHFULNESS

Gospel: Mark 10:17-30

Theme: Whom Do I Follow?



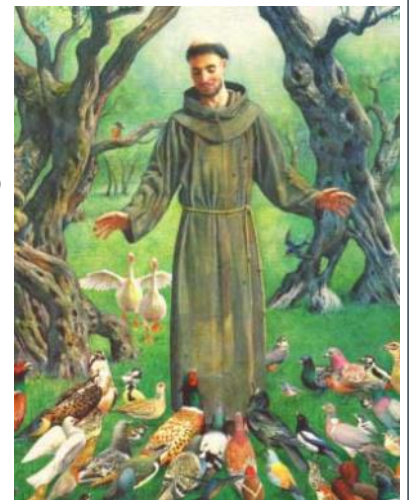
Scripture background: The rich man in this Sunday's gospel wants to follow Jesus but when Jesus suggests that along with following the **commandments**, the man should sell his belongings and give his money to help the poor. Upon hearing this, the man sadly walks away. Jesus teaches us how easy it is for the things we own to rule our lives. He compares the rich man to an overloaded camel. Jesus invites us to share our treasure of time, talent, and money. This is a good time to know and live God's **10 commandments**. The first 3 tell us how to love God. The other 7 tell us how to love others:

1. I am the Lord, your God. You shall have no other gods.
2. You shall not take my name in vain or with disrespect.
3. Remember to keep holy the Lord's Day.
4. Honor your father and your mother.
5. You shall not kill.
6. You shall not commit adultery.
7. You shall not steal.
8. You shall not lie or spread false things about others.
9. You shall not be jealous of another's spouse.
10. You shall not be jealous of your neighbor's belongings.

WE PRAY: "Our Father in heaven, help us to follow YOU no matter what we have to leave behind. Help us never to be afraid and to trust that you will never leave us." Amen.

WE TALK: What treasures of time, talent, and money could I share with my family, the poor, my communities, my church. What things do I hold on to that might be keeping me from following Jesus completely?
