According to The Times-Picayune Garden columnist, you can plant your Easter lily outside in a garden bed once the flowers have faded. Remove the plant from the pot and plant it into a well-prepared bed enriched with compost. Choose a location that receives morning sun and some afternoon shade. When the foliage yellows in midsummer, cut the plant down to the ground. They will begin to grow again in Oct. Fertilize them at that time. They will grow over the winter (don't worry about freezes) and should bloom next year in late April.
