.Dear Parishioners, Families and Friends,

Our Diocese of San Jose annually provides every parish an opportunity to participate in the Mission Cooperative Plan (aka. Mission Co-op). The plan is twofold. Firstly, it educates the people of God to the missionary work of the Church, and secondly, the people of God can provide financial assistance to mission-sending societies and mission dioceses. This year, Diocese of Gallup, New Mexico, has been assigned to our parish. Below is some information.

The purpose is to engage in the New Evangelization and to seek an encounter with the Living Christ by: responding to a personal call on conversion for ourselves so to help others respond to it through the Mission Co-op Plan; and through the experience of solidarity with the mission groups we welcome; and by deepening our communion with the members of the mission parishes to whom we provide resources. The Mission Co-op Plan funds the repair and or rebuilding of the churches (53 parishes) and missions (22 missions). The assistance is also used for spreading the Gospel i.e., means of transportation by providing the communities with ministers for Sunday Mass and catechesis. It funds the costs of materials and expenses associates with coordination of the volunteer and missionary groups that come to the Diocese to help with projects as described. Lastly, the funds cover the Diocese of Gallup, Office of Mission Resources operation, to acquire, disperse and account the Mission Co-op Plan assistance received. The Diocese of Gallup covers over 55,000 square miles of Northeastern Arizona state and Northwestern New Mexico state which encompasses seven Native American reservations and pueblos. It serves 63,000 Catholics and this makes it one of our Nation's largest and poorest Dioceses.

We look forward to welcoming Father Michael Carson, an assigned Mission Speaker, who will be at all Masses of the upcoming weekend of June 16/17, 2018. Please be advised that the envelopes for the collection of this year's Mission Co-op Plan are available in the vestibules. Thank you so much for your generous support.
