SOCIAL JUSTICE CORNER

As Christians we are told we are **NOT OF THIS WORLD** but to live in it and hold the values taught by Jesus sometimes seems impossible. In our first reading Adam blames Eve (whom he trusted because God put her there with him) for eating from the forbidden tree. We also know that the blame is put on the serpent, which then begins the concept of hatred. Another message here is God's cautionary reminder of who's voice you choose to listen to. We are humans, created by God and given free-will. What voice do you choose to listen to?

The second reading is a message that we Never Give Up. Our bodies are gradually dying, but we ourselves are being made stronger every day. Our troubles are getting us ready for an eternal glory that will make all our troubles seem like nothing. Our faith is grounded in the knowing that God is merciful. What is the trouble in your life that your faith can pull you through? Can you be the voice someone else here's in their time of need?

And finally in the Gospel, Jesus redraws the lines of family and belonging, saying that those who do God's will are siblings and mother to him. Jesus shows us the way to be in the world without being of it. Who belongs in your family and how can you acknowledge them?

.Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The three readings we have today should cause us to take great comfort in the fact that our own brokenness does not prevent us from being embraced by our Lord and Creator. From last Sunday's Gospel we learned that the eleven apostles worshipped the risen Christ at the same time that they "doubted" who He was. This week we see that His own family, Mary included, thought He may have been insane because they had come to "seize" Him. Only his few disciples, the men He had just named apostles, had some sense of who He was. Still, one of them denied Him in His hour of need while another one eventually betrayed Him for money. Yet He forgave them all because He loved them with a love we cannot even comprehend. Keep in mind that He even gave the Eucharist to Judas though He knew Judas had already planned his betrayal.

Several years ago I was given a copy of a painting that demonstrated His great love for Judas. Unfortunately, I brought it to a daily Mass to show the people and it somehow disappeared. Still its power remains with me. The picture has the risen Christ standing before His Father who is in the form a large bird with wings about to enfold His Son. The wounds from the Crucifixion are clearly visible on Jesus's hands holding Judas' corpse in His arms. Under the picture is the caption, "Jesus asking His Father to forgive Judas."

Also, we should not be off by the description of his family members as brother and sisters because the Aramaic or Greek word used to describe them does have the precise meaning of the English words. They could also mean cousins or step siblings. As anyone who is bilingual knows it is seldom possible for one language to be translated exactly what another language means. And while it could seem to some that Jesus is being rude to Mary in this scripture, that is not the case. Rather He is telling us that we are all just as important to Him as she is.

In fact, Jesus stresses that all our " sins and blasphemies" that we utter will be forgiven except the one that blasphemes against the Holy Spirit which the scribes do when they attribute Jesus' healing miracles to Satan rather than the Spirit. They do not receive forgiveness because they do not recognize they need it. Their judgmental egos prevent them from seeing the love that produces the healing and we must not let our own egos get in the way of showing love to all God's creatures, especially those with whom we disagree. How lucky we are to have a faith in such a loving Creator.

Peacemakers Fr. Mike would tell you that he is no hero. He is a quiet priest who graced our parish at one time. He is actually a very humble man – one who gives praise to others before himself. He now works in Washington, DC for the US Conference of Catholic Bishops in the department of Native American Affairs. Fr. Mike is a Choctaw native and he spent the last 8 summers in New Mexico at the Navaho reservation there. He enabled the pastor to take some time off and Fr. Mike said the experience there was a pleasure. Fr. Mike helped our parish find a sister parish in South Dakota who serve the Lakota-Sioux tribes and who were not far from the Pine Ridge Reservation which we have heard about in the news because of the pipeline. Sacred Heart Church in Pine Ridge, South Dakota, is one of the poorest parishes in the nation and was very generous in their thanks when we held a fund-raising drive for them last year. This year we hope to again raise awareness of Native American issues and send them a donation in July. Through his example, Fr. Mike has inspired us to remember the debt we owe to our Native American forbears, who suffered so much at the hands of the US and who continue to struggle in their lives
