## **ARCHBISHOP'S CALL TO SHARE BEGINS THIS WEEKEND!**

Today, with Archbishop Naumann's homily, we begin the annual Archbishop's Call to Share campaign, which is so vital in the life of the entire Archdiocese. We are all being asked how we can respond, especially through our financial support, to the church's activities in the spread of the Gospel and in responding to the needs of the poor. Please prayerfully consider how to best make your sacrificial offering this year. For information sake, our established target goals are **\$6,863.00 for St. Boniface** (\$6,364.00 last year); and **\$3,269.00 for St.**

**Therese** (\$3,321.00 last year). As a reminder, through your faithful generosity, last year's target goals were surpassed by both parishes, as has been the case almost every year - \$7,981.00 pledged by St. Boniface, and \$5,155.00 pledged by St. Therese. This is a very healthy sign of our gratitude to God for the many blessings we have received as individuals, as families, and as parish communities. Once again this year, I will run a weekly report on how we are doing - but if you have any questions, please don't hesitate to give me a call. **I am in need of a lay presenter from each parish to speak at Masses the weekend of January 24th and 25th. If you would be willing to do this, please let me know as soon as possible! Thanks!**

**KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS** - The Knights have begun their annual Baby Shower for those who are experiencing a crisis pregnancy or for those who are in need and raising children. You will notice the playpens at the entrance of both churches - please make your donations to the collection bins located in the playpens. Thank you for your support of this worthy project of the Knights! Also, the time is fast upon us for the Knights' breakfasts to begin again! **The first one will be held next Sunday, January 18th; and then February 22nd, March 29th (Palm Sunday), and the final breakfast will be on Sunday, April 19th.** Come and support the Knights and their good works, enjoy a wonderful breakfast (free will offering), and share in the fellowship either before or after joining the community for Sunday Mass. **ST. BONIFACE PARISH COUNCIL** - will meet this Sunday, January 11th, in the Priory dining room, immediately following Mass. We will welcome new Council members at this meeting!

**CCD** - Hopefully everyone got word in plenty of time for the cancellization of CCD last week due to the weather. We will begin (hopefully!) this Wednesday, January 14th. Our next Prayer Partner evening will be on Feb. 4th.

**SINGERS AND MUSICIANS WANTED!** - A number of people have indicated that they would be interested in forming a choir at each parish, as well as a combined choir for funerals and special occasions. We also could use additional musicians (organ, keyboard, brass, guitar, strings, etc.). This will only be successful if we have enough people who are committed to rehearsal times and to collaboratively working together for the benefit of BOTH parishes. If you are interested in doing this, please leave a message for me on the answering machine, or drop me a note, and let me know if you want to sing, or if you play an instrument - as well as what evening works best for you for rehearsal time (except Wednesdays). I do hope this will be of great benefit to both parishes and to our prayer together at the liturgy. Remember - those who sing, pray twice!!

**FINANCIAL PEACE UNIVERSITY** - you may have heard of this program, developed by Dave Ramsey - that guides individuals and families into developing sound financial practices based on Biblical principles. I am proposing using St. Boniface Hall as the host location of a future class. Classes run for about 90 minutes per weekly session, and run for 9 weeks. An individual or family fee of \$100 for the classes and materials is needed prior to or at the initial session. No dates have been established yet - but if you are interested in this, please let me know by note, e mail, or phone message. This can be open to our own parishioners, our family members, and our neighbors and friends. The average family pays off \$5,300 in debt and saves \$2,700 within the first 90 days after taking the course! Seems like a wise investment of \$100 to me!!! If we go ahead with this, further information and advertising will be forthcoming.

**END OF LIFE ISSUES** - the Archdiocese offers guidance to individuals and families regarding the writing of a will, Power of Attorney, financial endowments, and church teaching about ordinary and extraordinary measures of supporting life. If you would be interested in an evening regarding these issues, let me know and I will get a date set up for a session for our area.

**ALTAR SOCIETY DUES** - You will notice a pink envelope in your packets for Sunday, January 11th, for Altar Society Dues. **This is for St. Boniface parishioners ONLY**, and the dues are \$5.00. Please remember that all women and girls of the parish are encouraged and welcome to participate in the Altar Society. There will **NOT** be a second collection for the dues - please place your offering into the regular collection and it will get to the Altar Society! Thanks!

**HOME VISITS** - I make home visits and bring Holy Communion to our homebound members on Wednesdays, following the Mass at Richmond Healthcare and my Communion calls at Long Term Care in Garnett. If you know of anyone who would like for me to stop and visit them on a regular basis or even an occasional visit, please let me know or have them call me. Let's all keep our elderly, sick and homebound parishioners in our prayers!



## Baptism of the Lord
