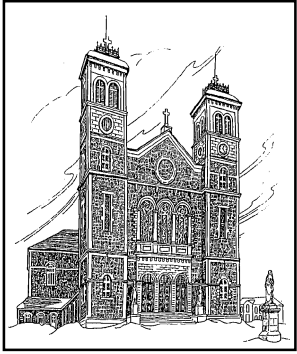

ASH WEDNESDAY, March 1st & GOOD FRIDAY, April 14th, are days of abstinence in which we are to refrain from eating meat. In addition, we are recommended to abstain from eating meat on the Fridays of Lent. Fasting in the Church tradition is that we do not eat full meals on Ash Wednesdays and Good Friday and it is a good tradition to carry on through the Lenten Season. In our Catholic tradition, we also have the tradition of giving up certain things during the Lenten Season such as alcohol/smoking/watching too much television, etc. the purpose of fasting is to draw us into a deeper relationship with the Lord. Do your best to ask the Lord to transform your heart during the Lenten Season.

EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - FEBRUARY 26TH, 2017

How do we measure God's care? We know instinctively that our God doesn't measure it – it is poured out abundantly, though at times we may not recognize that fact. Those devastated by terrible loss may find it hard to believe that God not only loves us but that, indeed, God is love itself. Still, in times of suffering, we may feel alone and forgotten. It is in such times that the message of the prophet Isaiah can come to us in our pain with the assurance that our God will never forget us. The challenge for all of us who call ourselves Christian is to believe in and, more importantly, to manifest divine love even in awful circumstances. Paul was accused of many things by people who disagreed with his teaching. While acknowledging his faults and possible mistakes, Paul held to one truth - he remained steadfast and trustworthy, holding to the task that God had given him. If we hear the comforting words of the offertory change for this week: "Do not be afraid, I am with you, I have called you each by name ... I love you and you are mine." God has (and IS) absolute love for us, why should we not have faith in Him?

Starting Ash Wednesday, March 1st and continuing throughout Lent, Mass will be celebrated in the Basilica ---- Monday through Friday at 12:10 pm. In the event of a funeral it will be celebrated at 9:30 am.

ASH WEDNESDAY: MASS WILL BE CELEBRATED AT 12:10 PM. AND 7:00 PM.

PLEASE MAKE A NOTE!! During Lent we will have a Lenten Tree decorated with paper crosses at the entrance of the Basilica. Written on the crosses will be the names of different items which could be donated for the personal care of the needy. We invite you to take a paper cross from the tree and on the following Saturday/Sunday bring back the specified item and place it in the basket provided at the entrance.

Your help is needed to ensure that our church has beautiful flowers – especially for the major festal seasons of Christmas and Easter. We have set up a '*flower fund*' in which you are invited to participate.

Our hope is that this will minimize the expense to the parish, and at the same time ensure that the **festive joy of the 'Great Fifty Days' of Easter will be apparent in our Easter flowers from the Easter Vigil until Pentecost.**

We ask that you place your donations in an envelope marked '**Flowers**' and place it in the collection. You are also invited to make your donation in memory of a loved one. Their names will be included from time to time in the bulletin. We have made envelopes available for you on the tables at the entrances to the Church.

LENT

Parishioners are encouraged to anticipate the coming of Lent, Ash Wednesday, March 1st. The following are some of the spiritual activities which could help us as we journey through Lent together.

- **Ash Wednesday:** Gather with the community for Mass at 12:10 pm. or 7:00 pm. and receive the Blessed Ashes.
- **Weekday Mass:** During Lent Mass will be celebrated Monday through Friday at 12:10 pm.
- **Eucharist:** Gather with the community for Sunday Eucharist, and, when possible, the weekday Eucharist.
- **Stations of the Cross** will be prayed each Friday in the Marian Chapel following 12:10 Mass.
- **Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament:** Wednesdays after the 12:10 pm. Mass for one hour in the Marian Chapel.

FORMS OF PENANCE: ABSTINENCE – FASTING – ALMSGIVING

- **Abstinence from Meat** is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years and older on Ash Wednesday & Good Friday.
- **Fasting** is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59.
- **Almsgiving:** These are charitable actions by which we come to the aid of our neighbours in their spiritual and bodily needs. Giving alms to the poor is a witness to fraternal charity. It is also a work of justice pleasing to God. In our parish, food or money may be donated to Emmaus House to help the needy. Each Sunday of Lent we ask the community to bring a specific non-perishable food item for Emmaus House. On Holy Thursday, the day of the Lords Supper, the Church asks us to remember the needy by bringing offerings of our choice of non-perishable food or money. We will also have a Lenten Tree at the entrance of the Church with suggestions of different personal care items for the needy.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

The Stations of the Cross will be prayed in the Marian Chapel on Friday after the 12:10 pm. Mass.

***** BASILICA & PARISH OFFICE OPENING/CLOSING TIMES**

The Basilica is open Monday through Friday from 8:00 am. – 4:00 pm.; Saturday 8:00 am. until after the 5:00 pm. Mass; and 8:00 am. – 12:30 pm. on Sunday. The Parish Office is open Monday through Friday (excluding holidays) from 9:00 am. to 4:30 pm. – closed for lunch 12 Noon to 1 pm. daily. SNOW CLEARING ... during the winter months when there is a heavy snowfall the east and west doors of the Basilica will be the first to be cleared. These entrances are to be used by all attending daily Mass. The main entrances will be cleared only after the east and west have been cleared. A reminder - when the schools in the city are closed because of inclement weather, the Mass for that day will be cancelled. Of course sometimes it does snow on the weekend ... if in doubt about whether or not Mass is being celebrated ... please tune in to the local radio stations and/or call the parish office (754-2170).

THE CATECHETICAL OFFICE at the Basilica provides parents with the resources to form their children in faith and prepare them to celebrate the sacraments. This process has two foci, namely, the home and the parish. This year we will provide some materials for families to use at home. We will invite families to get involved in the various liturgical ministries at the Sunday liturgy, namely, present the gifts of bread and wine, prepare the altar, carry cross and candles and proclaim the readings. The catechetical formation at the Basilica will also emphasize the liturgical year, especially the seasons of Advent, Christmas—Epiphany as well as Lent-Easter-Pentecost because they are extremely important for faith formation. This year we will celebrate a rite of welcome for children and families who are preparing to celebrate the sacraments of Confirmation and first Eucharist. Part of this celebration will be to present the child with a copy of the lectionary because the Word of God is very important in the faith formation of every Christian.
