

**SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME - JANUARY 14<sup>TH</sup>, 2018**

The readings proclaimed today are all about listening, call, and response. Throughout our lives we have encounters with countless numbers of people. Some will pass fleetingly through our lives, others will have a deep and profound influence on us. There will be others who will call us out of ourselves into becoming all we are called by God to be. Some will speak God's voice to us from other faith traditions. For each of us, the call will be unique - but as it was with Samuel in the first reading, there will be Eli's in our life who will help us hear the voice of God. Like Samuel, we may be summoned to be prophet, or like Andrew, John and Peter, to discipleship. God calls us in many ways and at many different levels. Every vocation is a call to the fullness of love. God called us into life. Throughout our lives God continues to call us to a new life worthy of our dignity as God's children. At death God will call us from this life into eternal life. At the heart of every vocation is the invitation of Jesus to 'come and see'. Do we have the courage to answer his invitation to 'come and see' Jesus in the poor and the marginalized, in the un-employed, in the depressed, in those in our prisons, in our long-term institutions, in those whose human rights have been violated? Make no mistake, though when God calls, God insists on your response. How do we respond? Do we allow our hearts and minds to 'be still' and to listen to what God is speaking to us? Do we then have the trust to respond with 'here I am, Lord'?

### **PETITION Re: Clause 14 of Bill C-51**

#### **which seeks to repeat second 176 (1,2,3) of the Criminal Code of Canada**

This section of the Criminal Code makes it an indictable offense to obstruct or cause violence to an officiating clergyman or minister, as well as to disturb religious worship or gatherings. It protects the people, the churches and the denominations who gather to celebrate their faith, worship God, and reach out in love and service of their sisters and brothers in need.

On the evening of 8 November 2017, the Parliamentary Standing Committee for Justice and Human Rights voted to amend clause 14 of Bill C-51 so as to retain section 176 of the Criminal Code with a new provision to encompass unequivocally all religious and spiritual services. The amended Bill will now return to the Minister of Justice for consideration, then both Houses of Parliament, followed by Royal Assent. Since the amended Bill has yet to pass into law and in view of the possibility of resistance to the proposed amendment, the Honourable Rob Nicholson, Member of Parliament for Niagara Falls, has written and forwarded to us a petition, which seeks the support of all Canadians in **asking the Government of Canada to retain section 176 of the criminal Code.**

A petition to retain Section 176 of the Criminal Code is at the back of the Church. Please find the time to sign this petition to keep this important section of the Criminal Code.
