Society of St. Vincent de Paul - St. Joseph Conference

End Poverty Through Systemic Change

The mission of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul: to join in a bond of friendship, and to grow spiritually by offering person-to-person service to those who are needy and suffering, in the tradition of our founder, Blessed Frederic Ozanam, and patron, St. Vincent de Paul.

During June 2018, SVdP St. Joseph Conference members made 24 person-to-person home visits to those in need in our community. In some cases, we made several follow-up visits that are not included in the 24 visits. One example, we received a request from a grandmother whose grandson coming home from the hospital with his new born baby experienced an engine blow out to the vehicle he was driving. With no drivable vehicle and limited money to get vehicle repaired, the grandson lost his job. The grandmother asked if we could help with a down payment for another vehicle, so her grandson could get back to work. This request was beyond our normal request for assistance for rent, utilities, food, etc.

After our initial home visit to better understand the situation, the following actions were taken:

- We suggested to the family that the vehicle be repaired rather than purchasing another vehicle which would add additional car payments beyond those already being made on existing vehicle.
- We assisted the family to arrange for the vehicle to be repaired at a local dealership at significant cost savings and to secure a loan at a local bank for the repairs.
- Being without a vehicle, we took the mother and baby to necessary follow-up doctor visits and to the food pantry.
- Because of their need, we provided this young family some previously donated furniture and household items and assisted on their electric bill, which was our only out of pocket expense.

The grandson is now back to work. We hope our assistance and mentoring will provide the impetus for a better life.

With 28 requests for assistance and 24 home visits, June was a very busy month.

Our income for June was \$1,170.00. This does not include funds to be reimbursed from St. Michael Catholic Church for assistance provided in their area.

Our expense for June was \$4,260.37. This includes our National solidarity dues of \$375.00 to SVdP Louisville Council.

On July 1, 2018, District 1 (Seven Conferences in New Albany Deanery) of the SVdP Louisville Council became Southern Indiana District Council of the SVdP Archdiocesan of Indianapolis Council. Jim Koerber was elected President, District Council. Ron Deatrick was elected to replace Jim as President, St. Joseph Conference.

The three essential elements of the Society: Spirituality, Friendship and Service. We continue to ask for your prayers and spiritual and financial support. We welcome any questions concerning Vincentian service and invite anyone interested in becoming a Vincentian to join us in this rewarding endeavor. We normally meet on the second Tuesday each month at 7:00 pm at St. Joseph Catholic Church, Corydon.
