The role of the Parish Council is to serve as a consultative body to the Pastor. They assist the Pastor in formulating policies concerning parish and pastoral matters, and assist in establishing goals and objectives based on the emerging needs of the parish community. You must be 18 years of age or older to be considered for a nomination. Council members serve a term of three years and attend quarterly meetings until their term is completed. Elected members can only serve two consecutive terms. New members will begin their position at the meeting in June. You are encouraged to nominate persons who fit the criteria and that you think would enjoy working with other parishioners in supporting our Pastor. You may nominate yourself or others. It would be helpful to talk with the nominee before nominating to be sure they are willing to consider the position. It would certainly cut down on phone calls that will have to be made. All persons nominated will be contacted the week of April 15th so they can either accept or decline the nomination before names are added to the ballot. If you know you will not be at mass on the weekend of April 28th and would like to be included in the vote, please contact the parish office for a ballot.

The Stations of the Cross are an ancient tradition in the Catholic Church going back to the fourth century when Christians went on pilgrimage to the Holy Land. The Stations of the Cross allow us to reflect upon Jesus' suffering, death, and resurrection. The Stations of the Cross serve as a stark reminder of the humble manner in which Jesus was willing to set aside any privilege of deity in order to provide a path to salvation through His sacrifice. From the earliest of days, followers of Jesus told the story of his passion, death and resurrection. When pilgrims came to see Jerusalem, they were anxious to see the sites where Jesus was. These sites become important

holy connections with Jesus. Eventually, following in the footsteps of the Lord, along the way of the cross, became a part of the pilgrimage visit. The stations, as we know them today, came about when it was no longer easy or even possible to visit the holy sites. In the 1500's, villages all over Europe started creating "replicas" of the way of the cross, with small shrines commemorating the places along the route in Jerusalem. Eventually, these shrines became the set of 14 stations we now know and were placed in almost every Catholic Church in the world. The most important thing to remember is that this can be as personal as you would like it to be. One of our common religious struggles is to realize that we are not alone. The Good News is that Jesus entered into our life's experience completely - even suffering and death - and that he fell into the hands of a Loving God, who raised him from death to life. We can have complete hope that suffering and death have no complete hold on us. We will all share eternal life with him, if we can fall into the hands of the same Loving God. And, along the way, we are not alone. Jesus is with us as one who knows our suffering, and the death we face. That can be deeply consoling.

Please be Reverent and Quiet before Mass. Please be considerate of others in prayer and meditation. Thank You!
