FROM THE DESK OF MSGR. JOHN CODY

Dear parishioners and friends

1. **Holy Trinity** – The Sunday after Pentecost is devoted to contemplation of the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity, Jesus revealed to us the life of the Trinity, and then left it up to us to try our best to explain it! St. Patrick used the Shamrock, others use a triangle and there are other illustrations. However, the doctrine of the Church is that there is One God, in three Divine Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Each of them truly God, but not three Gods but only one! Our puny minds cannot understand how something can be one and yet three. Some of the most interesting heresies in the history of the Church have to do with trying to explain the Holy Trinity, Many Pastors ask their deacons to preach on the Holy Trinity, and accordingly, I have asked Deacon Byron, our faithful parish deacon, to preach this weekend!
2. **8th Grade Trip to Chicago** – We add our prayers and best wishes to our 8th graders in Trinity Elementary and their parents and teachers who are journeying to the Windy City for their annual school trip. Sadly, I am not able to join them this year due to my retirement which is quickly creeping up on me. Too much to do, Keep praying!
3. **BAA** – We are off to a good start with the BAA here at St. Christopher. Thus far, we have pledged **\$48,487.00** to help us reach our goal of **\$71,726.90**. As I said last week, one of my goals this year for our parish is to bring up the percentage of participation. Only a little more than 25% participate in this annual fund drive. It goes without saying that the obligation to support the church, which includes the diocese, should be borne by more than 25% of the congregation. In these days when parishes are closing and being combined with others, the financial sustainability of each parish becomes an important determinate in their continued existence. St. Christopher is in no danger of closing because of finances. However, we need not only get by: we need to prosper. We cannot do this without your generosity. Too few have carried the burden for too long. I ask each family or wage earner to consider making a pledge of **\$600.00**. Some can afford much more, some much less. But the important thing is participation. Christian maturity involves taking responsibility for the support of the parish church as well as the diocesan church. I will be saying more about this in the near future. It has been my experience that whenever a new pastor arrives, the collections drop significantly. I've had to go through this four times myself in each of my four pastorates. This predictable drop in collections is regrettable, deplorable, inexcusable and disappointing. I will not hesitate to prepare for a new pastor without preparing all of you to welcome him and support him, which includes support of the Church. We not only owe that to him. but to the Lord Jesus who sends us a new pastor to provide us with the spiritual leadership we all need. More on this later!
4. **Goodbye Deacon David Loeffler** – Our deacon from the Josephinum this year will be leaving us soon. As is our custom for the past few years, we'd like to take up a collection as a parting gift from us, and symbolic of our prayer and gratitude for his ministry among us this past year. **This second collection will take place at all Masses this weekend, May 21 and 22.** I will be attending Deacon David's ordination in Phoenix in mid-June and want to present him with our gift in gratitude for his service here.
5. **Year of Mercy** – Our Holy Father, Pope Francis is challenging all of us to devote ourselves to the practice of mercy. We tend to be a hard-hearted lot, wanting severe punishment

for everyone else but ourselves. Our Lord Jesus has said in Luke's gospel and elsewhere, "be merciful as your Father is merciful. This involves a change of heart on our part, and a willingness to forgive and forget – especially when there are people who have hurt us. Being merciful does not mean that we let everyone get away with anything. But it is a challenge for us to reconcile with one another, and to allow people to learn from their mistakes. The woman caught in adultery, Zacchaeus in the tree, and the other sinners who were outcasts in society found a friend in Jesus. We too should be ministers of reconciliation. One excellent way to observe this Holy Year is to give emphasis to the works of mercy. In case you have forgotten them, here they are:

Corporal Works of Mercy:

Feed the hungry	Shelter the homeless
Give drink to the thirsty	Visit the sick and imprisoned
Clothe the naked	Bury the dead

Spiritual Works of Mercy

Admonish sinners	Instruct the uninformed
Counsel the doubtful	Comfort the sorrowful
Bear wrongs patiently	Forgive offenses
Pray for the living and the dead	

If we devote ourselves to practicing these, we will go a long way to observing the Holy Year in a fitting way.

6. **Evangelization** – **Bring a Friend or Family member to Church!** Evangelization is a big word that simply means: "handing on the faith." In the past, we relied on the professionals to do this, the priests, brothers and sisters in religious life. With the diminishing numbers of the clergy and religious, and the increasing number of Catholics, the laity must get involved in this effort. The New Evangelization, much spoken of in today's church, has to do with outreach to non-practicing Catholics. All of us know some who, for whatever reason, do not practice their faith. Sometimes, all it takes is an invitation to church with us that gets them back on track. Would that all knew the strength and comfort we receive through the Sacraments of the Church. Issue that invitation to someone you care about today! Come home to the Church in 2016!

Today, on the first Sunday after Pentecost we are celebrating and honoring the Most Holy Trinity. Liturgically, this Solemnity; Holy Day of Obligation, is associated with the color white and is specifically symbolic of the Unity of the Trinity; the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.
