# ADMINISTRATION

*You have the tools to build the kingdom of god. Pass them on well worn.*

## **Finance Council**

Meet once a month (except July). Review monthly financial statements. Support and advise the pastor in his stewardship of the parish financial resources.

## **Front Desk Receptionist**

Answer the switchboard phone, transferring calls to employees. Greet people who come into the office. Light office tasks such as stapling, sorting, etc. Opportunities are available for a four hour shift each week or as a substitute.

## **Grounds Crew**

Assist with various aspects of maintaining the grounds. Opportunities available include: mowing the grass, plant and flower caretaking, and shoveling.

## **Money Counting**

Help count the weekend collections and prepare the bank deposit. The commitment is every other Monday morning for two to four hours.

## **Maintenance Committee**

Meet once a month. Responsibilities include planning for capital improvements, identifying maintenance needs, and working with the maintenance staff and parish business administrator to obtain objectives.

## **Parish Council**

Meet once a month (except July). The council provides consultative support and assistance to the Pastor. Its goal is to identify and meet the pastoral, spiritual, and temporal needs of the parish community and to provide leadership for parishioners.

### **Council of Catholic Women (CCW)**

CCW supports, empowers and educates women in spirituality, leadership and service. All women in the parish automatically belong to CCW. This is an avenue in which women can enjoy fellowship and also respond to the needs of the parish and greater community.

### **Knights of Columbus**

The largest Catholic fraternal service organization. Provides charitable services, promotes Catholic education, and actively defends Catholicism. There are monthly meetings and other selected activities.

## **ATHLETICS**

### **Coaching**

Assist with coaching the various teams. We offer volleyball, boys and girls basketball, softball, baseball, and boys and girls soccer.

### **Officiating**

Referees and umpires are needed for the various home games and tournaments.

### **Concessions Stand**

Volunteers are needed to work at the concession stand during home games and tournaments. Responsibilities would include making popcorn and hot dogs, selling the various foods and beverages, and cleaning up at the conclusion of the event.

### **Sell Tickets**

Volunteers would sell tickets to the home games and tournaments.

### **Uniform Repairs**

Help us repair the teams’ uniforms by utilizing your sewing skills.

## DEVELOPMENT

### **Bingo**

Help out at our fall or spring bingo. We need people to sell food and beverages.

### **Craft Sale**

This event is held in November. Volunteers are needed to work in the kitchen, bake sale, and as cashiers.

### **Fun Fest**

This is Immaculate's biggest event, which runs over three days. Volunteers are needed for event set-up/take down, games, food, beverages, silent auction, thrift sale, youth activities, money counting, and marketing.

### **Oktoberfest**

Areas of need include: bartending, kitchen help, serving food, set up and cleaning.

### **New Members Welcome Team**

Share your excitement of Immaculate and your experience by welcoming new members. Participate in and plan new members orientation (three per year), campus tours, annual dinner and other welcoming activities and programs.

### **Planned Giving Committee (Legacy Society)**

Help Immaculate prepare for its future by building up our endowment fund. Meet with families to discuss future legacies, educate parishioners on the program, and plan and attend events around this ministry.

### **Stewardship Committee**

Meet once a month (except June and July). Committee helps plan and implement strategies to spread the message of discipleship throughout the parish. This may include celebrating ministries and fostering awareness of God's many gifts to us.

## **FAITH FORMATION**

### **Adult Formation**

Volunteers are needed to help lead bible studies and faith enrichment events.

### **Charismatic Prayer Group**

This group meets every Tuesday evening from 7:00 to 9:00. Prayer meetings typically include a period of praise and worship followed by a faith sharing or a talk by a member of the prayer group or a guest speaker. The meeting ends with social fellowship.

### **Confirmation**

Catechists are needed for the Confirmation team, which plans and presents lessons to our candidates.

### **Confirmation Retreat**

Volunteers are needed to assist with the Confirmation retreat.

### **Family Formation (Grades K-6)**

Catechists are needed to assist in the preparation of a lesson for the first Wednesday of the month from September through May. They also meet for instruction on the month's topic. Plan and assist with the FFCC (Family Formation Community Connection) evening for the families.

### **Junior High Formation**

Catechists prepare lessons and then meet with students three Mondays a month from September through May.

### **Liturgy of the Word**

Volunteers teach the readings to Pre-k through 2<sup>nd</sup> grade children during the 10:00 Mass.

### **RCIA/RCIC**

Sponsors are needed for the candidates going through the initiation programs for joining the Catholic Faith. Sponsors commit to accompany the catechumen or candidate during his/her formation period.

### **Vacation Bible Camp**

Adult and teen volunteers lead children, Pre-K through 5<sup>th</sup> grade, in a week of faith and fun filled activities. This event takes place during the last week in June from 8:00 am to 12:00 pm.

### **Youth Activities**

Event coordinators are needed. Volunteers are also needed to assist with and chaperone at various youth events, some of which are overnight. These include Winter Blast, The Hunger Retreat, Friday Nite Live, and Summer Stretch.

### **Youth Mission Trip**

Drivers and chaperones are needed as our youth venture to poverty stricken areas of the Midwest to lend assistance. This social justice endeavor takes place for one week over the summer months.

# LITURGY

## **Adoration**

"*Could you not spend one hour with me?*" Grow spiritually each moment you spend with Jesus. Sign up to spend one hour a week in our Adoration chapel in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

## **Altar Server**

Assist the priest during Mass. This is open to all adults and children 4<sup>th</sup> Grade and older.

## **Art and Environment**

This is the group that plans, organizes, decorates the church for each liturgical season; Advent, Christmas, Ordinary Time, Lent, Triduum, and Easter. Time commitment is 5 to 10 hours per season.

## **Church Servant**

Do you like to do behind the scenes work? This group is for you. Help clean and set the church up during the week in preparation for the weekend Masses.

## **Eucharistic Minister**

Distribute the Eucharist (both species) to the assembly. This ministry is open to members 16 years of age and older who have been confirmed.

## **Greeter**

Create a welcoming atmosphere by greeting parishioners as they enter the Church for Mass. This is a great family ministry!

**Lector**

Must have good reading skills and a clear voice. Lectors read the word of God during weekend liturgies. This is open to adults and youth (7<sup>th</sup> grade and older).

**Lending Library**

Vacuum and dust the library weekly. Dust book shelves and window ledges as needed. Straighten rows of books and make sure everything is picked up and neat.

**Linen Caretaker**

Take care of and clean the various linens used for liturgical celebrations.

**Liturgy Commission**

Plan and set policies for the liturgical life of the parish. The committee meets one Wednesday morning a month from 9:00 to 10:30 am.

**Sacristan**

Make sure that the altar and sanctuary are in complete readiness for the Mass. This would include ensuring the sound system is on, all items needed for the Communion are in their proper places, and that there are enough hosts and unconsecrated wine available

**Usher**

Assist with the weekend Masses by helping parishioners find seating at weekend Masses, take up the collection, and ensure that people go up to the altar in an organized fashion for Communion. Open to anyone at least six years of age.

## **Adult Choir**

Lead the assembly in singing at a Sunday morning Mass. The commitment is September through May; also singing at major feast days. Open to 9<sup>th</sup> grade students through adults. Rehearsals are on Wednesday evening from 7:00 to 9:00 pm.

## **Cabaret**

Join us in the variety show and dinner fundraiser. We also need volunteers to decorate, clear tables, wash dishes, and clean the kitchen.

## **Cantor**

Lead the assembly in singing at the weekend Masses. You need not be a member of the choir. Rehearsals are set between you and the accompanist.

## **Children's Choir (grades 2-8)**

This choir sings for major feast days (Christmas, Easter, etc.) and other Saturday evening Masses throughout the year. Rehearsal is on Thursdays from 6:00 - 7:00 pm.

## **Funeral Schola**

The Schola sings for all funerals and is open to all adults. Members are called as funerals occur and meet one half-hour prior to the funeral to rehearse. Members are not expected to sing for every funeral due to their inconsistent scheduling, but are welcome to join when able.

### **Hand bell Choir**

Come learn and play in a hand bell ensemble. This ensemble plays at various Masses throughout the year. The commitment is from September through May. Rehearsals are Thursday evenings from 7:00 to 9:00 pm.

### **Music Librarians**

Volunteer to organize and maintain the music library for the parish and school.

### **Care Center Visits, Hospital, and Homebound Ministry**

Visit parishioners who are hospitalized, homebound or living in local care centers. Bring them support, company, and the Eucharist.

### **Communion Services/Off-Site Masses**

Escort residents to the chapel and back. Participate in the liturgy with them.

### **Funeral Lunches**

Help support our funeral ministry by serving a catered lunch to funeral guests. This also includes washing dishes and cleaning the kitchen afterwards.

### **God's Calling Ministry**

Assist in making calls to remind volunteers of upcoming meetings or events.

### **Lenten Soup Suppers**

Help prepare and serve soup for lunch on Fridays in Lent. Lunch is served from 11:30 am to 1:00 pm. Washing dishes and cleaning the kitchen afterwards is also required. You can volunteer for one or more lunches each Lenten season.

### **Prayer Blankets**

Assist in cutting and hand stitching of small fleece blankets that are given to the sick.

### **Prayer Tree**

Pray in the privacy of your home for those who request prayers, all communication is by phone.

### **Young at Heart**

Coordinate meetings and events for the parish's senior citizens. A minimum of a one year time commitment is required.

## **SCHOOL**

### **Alumni Development Council**

Meet with the principal, staff, alumni and friends of the school quarterly. Plan and assist with mailings. Plan and coordinate alumni events. Focus is on outreach.

### **Food Service**

Assist Food Service Coordinator with setting up food for easy distribution to serve to the students at lunch. This requires approximately an hour and a half of time. Work one day a week from 11:00 am-12:30 pm or more.

### **Home and School Events**

Assist with the public relations and fundraising activities for the school. These include community nights (two per year), spaghetti dinner, book fair, 8<sup>th</sup> grade car wash, poinsettia sale, and candy sale. Participate in one or several.

### **Marathon**

Volunteers are needed to help out with this major school fundraiser that takes place on the first Saturday morning in October. Areas of need include event planning and assisting at the event itself.

### **Queen of May Dinner and Auction for Catholic Education**

This is a major school fundraiser that is held on the first Friday in May. Help is needed in the planning stages (committee), room decorating, bussing dishes, washing dishes, and the silent auction. The success of this event is very gratifying.

### **School Advisory Council**

Meets monthly September through June. The council acts in an advisory capacity to the principal and pastor. Areas of emphasis are planning, policy development, and public relations.

**Giving Tree**

This is our Christmas ministry. Volunteers are needed to set up a Christmas tree in the narthex. Descriptions of gifts required are hung on the tree. Parishioners purchase and bring the gifts to Church. The gifts then need to be sorted and distributed to those in need.

**Meals on Wheels**

Deliver meals to the homebound over the lunch hour. Immaculate is on a six week rotation, which means we are responsible to deliver meals every six weeks for the entire week. Volunteers can commit to one or more days during that week.
