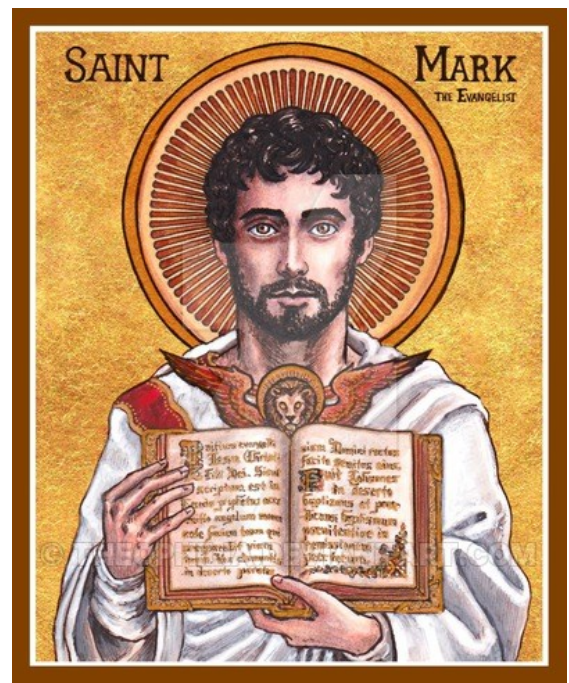


THE GOSPEL OF MARK

On the Sundays of 2018 the Gospel of Mark is proclaimed throughout Advent, and most of Ordinary Time. Join us for two sessions as Leota Roesch leads us through a study of and reflection on Mark's Gospel.

Leota, recently retired after more than 45 years in pastoral ministry, formerly served 20+ years as a director in the youth office of the Archdiocese of San Antonio, serving in collaboration with the catechetical ministry of the archdiocese. She also served most recently in the catechetical office of the Diocese of Phoenix and as Director of Parish Faith Formation in two parishes in that diocese. Additionally she has a background in liturgy /spirituality and in scripture and continues her writing for Franciscan Media Homily Helps and Youth Ministry Access for the Center for Ministry Development.

Mark's Gospel has often been described as a passion narrative with an extended introduction. This is not an exaggeration. The entire Gospel is oriented toward the passion and resurrection of Jesus. In this year of Mark we will recall this trajectory to help shape our proclamation of the passion and resurrection during Holy Week and the Easter season.
