John the Baptist – A Voice Crying Out in the Desert

Today, John the Baptist announces an invitation to a new beginning not only to turn away from personal choices that impede God's coming but also to a collective repentence and a turn towards divine mercy. John the Baptist



announced the advent of Jesus. He himself lived a life of radical self-denial, but he did not require this of those who came to hear his message. What he preached was repentance, or change of heart, not a rejection of the circumstances of life but of the character of that life. He called for a return to righteousness, to lives of integrity, to relationships rooted in honesty and

respect. He spoke against presumption and arrogant reliance on one's religious origin, against complacency and the shirking of responsibility, against disinterest in the welfare of others.

This is a powerful image in a world such as ours, where we are tempted to compromise our principles in favor of enhancing our status, where we are instructed to get what we want with the least amount of effort, where we are encouraged to disregard the needs of others and take care of "number one."

REFLECTION

God Speaks Anew

In Advent we focus on two events: we put ourselves in the time of preparation for the first coming of Christ, and we kindle anew our expectation for his second coming. The second coming had been in the forefront of our attention on the last few Sundays of the Church year and especially on the First Sunday of Advent. Then, from the Second Sunday of Advent on, the first coming moves to the front of the stage; yet, the second coming is not ignored altogether, as the second reading shows. The importance of Advent expectation for God to act lies in the fact that human beings cannot produce their own salvation. The resources for salvation do not lie within the possibilities of humans, they can only come from outside. The recognition of God's active presence in our lives presumes that we are at a loss to save ourselves. So the *Prayer over the Offerings* allows for a plea for help when it says, Come, we pray, to our rescue with the protection of your mercy. In a way, such a petition at the altar of God positions us precisely within sight of a restored Jerusalem, rejoicing that we are remembered by God. God is among us Emmanuel.
