First Reading

Deuteronomy 6:2-6

Moses spoke to the people, saying "Fear the Lord your God, you and your son and your son's son, by keeping all his statutes and his commandments, which I command you, all the days of your life; that your days may be prolonged. Hear therefore, O Israel, and be careful to do them; that it may go well with you, and that you may multiply greatly, and the Lord, the God of your fathers, has promised you, in a land flowing with milk and honey. "Hear, O Israel; the Lord our God is one Lord; and you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might. And these words which I command you this day shall be upon your heart.

Second Reading

Hebrews 7:23-28

Brethren: the priests [of the former covenant] were many in number, because they were prevented by death from continuing in office; but Christ holds his priesthood permanently, because he continues for ever. Consequently he is able for all time to save those who draw near to God through him, since he always lives to make intercessions for them. For it was fitting that we should have such a high priest, holy, blameless, unstained, separated from sinners, exalted above the heavens. He has no need, like those high priests, to offer sacrifices daily, first for his own sins and then for those of the people; he did this once for all when he offered up himself. Indeed, the law appoints men in their weakness as high priests, but the word of the oath, which came later than the law, appoints a Son who has been made perfect for ever.

The Holy Gospel

Mark 12:28b-34

At that time: One of the scribes came up to Jesus and asked him, "Which commandment is the first of all?" Jesus answered, "The first is, 'Hear O Israel: the Lord our God, the Lord is one; and you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength.' The second is this, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these." And the scribe said to him, "You are right, Teacher; you have truly said that he is one, and there is no other but he; and to love him with all the heart, and with all the understanding, and with all the strength, and to love one's neighbor as oneself, is much more than all whole burnt offerings and sacrifices." And when Jesus saw that he answered wisely, he said to him, "You are not far from the kingdom of God." And after that no one dared to ask him any question.

All Souls' Day – Plenary Indulgence

A plenary indulgence is granted the faithful who, on All Souls' Day or on the Sunday preceding or following it, devoutly visits a church or an oratory and recites an Our Father and the Creed.

Requirements for obtaining a plenary indulgence:

Do the work while in a state of grace,

Receive Sacramental confession within 20 days of the work (several plenary indulgences may be earned per reception),

Receive Eucharistic communion (one plenary indulgence may be earned per reception),

Pray for the pope's intentions (Our Father and Hail Mary, or other appropriate prayer, is sufficient),

Have no attachment to sin (even venial) – i.e., it is sufficient that the Christian makes an act of the will to love God and despise sin.

Requirements for a partial indulgence: The work must be done while in a state of grace and with the general intention of earning an indulgence.

To the Parishioners of St. Mary the Virgin,

For the last several weeks I have offered an extended reflection on the background and meaning of Our Lady of the Rosary for the month of October. Fr. Cipolla in those reflections used as the title: "God is Concerned with the Presence of Truth in the World He Created." Traditionally the month of November is noted as the month of Holy Souls and Christ the King of the Universe precedes All Saints and All Souls, making the connection that Christ the King is King of *all* creation. The new Catholic calendar has Christ the King being the last Sunday of Time after Trinity (what is euphemistically called "ordinary time.") For the elucidation of our faith, we will not quibble whether the Church Triumphant (All Saints) and the Church Expectant (the souls in Purgatory) goes before or after the proclamation of Christ the King of the Universe. Both can work. For us, for November, may we contemplate and pray on the truth that indeed all of creation, heaven and earth and everything in-between is from the hand of God and therefore, God is indeed the King of the Universe. And that means....what exactly...in this time of modernity and celebration of self? That is what we will explore on this page and in our discussions BTM – Between-the-Masses, which will begin Sunday November 4. One of the most ardent and profound proponents of the Social Kingship of Christ was Cardinal Pie of France (1815-1880).

He wrote: "Jesus Christ has been constituted the King of kings. Yes - and the true glory, the true nobility of kings, ever since the preaching of the Gospel, has consisted in being the lieutenants of Jesus Christ on earth. Has the greatness of kings been diminished by the crosses glittering atop their diadems? Have their thrones been less renowned or less secure on account of their kingship being recognised as an emanation of, and participation in, the kingship of Jesus Christ? Jesus Christ is King, and the true dignity, the true liberty, the true emancipation of modern nations lies in their right to be governed in a Christian manner. Have such nations fallen short of their glory? Has their fate been less noble, less happy on account of their ruling sceptres being bound to submit to the sceptre of Jesus? Let it be repeated, brethren: Christianity does not reach its full development, its full maturity, where it does not take on a social character. Such is what Bossuet expressed in this way: 'Christ does not reign if his Church is not mistress, if the peoples cease to pay to Jesus Christ, to his doctrine, to his law, a national homage.' When the Christianity of a country is reduced to the bare proportions of the domestic life, when Christianity is no longer the soul of public life, of public power, of public institutions, then Jesus Christ deals with this country in the manner he is there dealt with. He continues to give his grace and his blessings to the individuals who serve him, but he abandons the institutions, the powers which do not serve him; and the institutions, the kings, the nations become like shifting sand in the desert, they fall away like the autumn leaves which are gone with the wind."
