We are now looking for donations to pay for some additional items to help complete the renovations. But in the midst of our busyness in trying to complete the work, it is important to reflect on why we are making these changes.

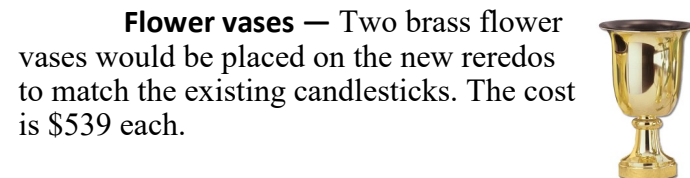
Ultimately everything we have belongs to God. We are just temporary stewards. In this, his house, we want to give back to him the best we have to offer from what has been provided to us. That is the sentiment that built the great cathedrals of Europe and some of the beautiful parishes and cathedrals in our own country. And these great sanctuaries were built by people who had far less material wealth than we possess.

Our faithful ancestors understood that heaven and earth were meeting at our altars. They wanted their sanctuaries to reflect the glory of God and pay tribute to the beauty of his creation.

So as we start the final phase of our improvements, please give prayerful consideration to making a donation. You may make a donation toward a specific item we have already identified or a make a general donation to go to Fr. Dean's wish list. Here are some of the items and their costs identified so far.



St. Peter Statue — Thanks to your incredible generosity, this statue mentioned in a previous bulletin has been fully funded by your donations and has been ordered. The statue of St. Peter holding the keys of the kingdom will be placed on one of the niches in the new reredos in honor of the Ordinariate's patron saint, St. Peter, and the St. Peter of the Rock community who became a part of St. Mary the Virgin.



Flower vases — Two brass flower vases would be placed on the new reredos to match the existing candlesticks. The cost is \$539 each.



Reliquaries — In addition to the relic of the wood of the cross, St. Mary the Virgin possesses 16 other relics, which will be available for veneration on one of the new side altars. To display the relics, we need eight small oval reliquaries and eight small round reliquaries. The cost is \$29.95 for each reliquary.

Oriental carpet — While an exact carpet has not been selected yet, Fr. Dean would like an oriental carpet to be placed in front of the altar.

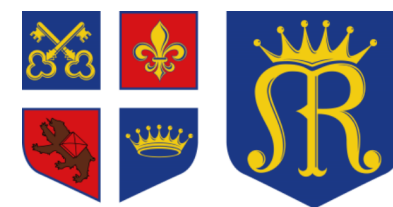

Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

At that time: the Lord appointed seventy others, and sent them on ahead of him, two by two, into every town and place where he himself was about to come. And he said to them, “The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; pray therefore the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest. Go your way; behold, I send you out as lambs in the midst of wolves. Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals; and salute no one on the road. Whatever house you enter, first say, ‘Peace be to this house!’ And if a son of peace is there, your peace shall rest upon him; but if not, it shall return to you. And remain in the same house, eating and drinking what they provide, for the laborer deserves his wages; do not go from house to house.
