

# To the Parishioners of St. Mary the Virgin

When you read this it will still be less than 3 weeks since my cancer surgery. In some ways it seems a lifetime ago. I am getting stronger and for that I give thanks to God, as I give thanks for all your prayers. I especially give thanks for the time and discipline to renew and reacquaint myself with extended prayer time and devotions. I love the psalms and especially psalm 29. If there is dryness or doubt or confusion in your conversation with God, go to the psalms. I offer you this translation which comes from my traditional breviary. We hear a fundamental law of the kingdom: "At nightfall comes weeping, but with the dawn, rejoicing... You turned my mourning into joy."

## Psalm 29 (Traditional) 30 (Modern)

*(Thanksgiving for protection (in peril, sickness, death))*

I will extol You, O Lord, for You upheld me, and did not let my enemies gloat over me.  
O Lord, my God, I cried out to You, and You healed me.  
O Lord, You brought my soul up from the netherworld; You preserved me from those going down into the pit.

*(God's mercy)*

Sing praise to the Lord, you His Saints, give thanks and remember His holiness.  
For there is wrath in His indignation and life in His good will;  
At nightfall comes weeping, but with the dawn rejoicing.

*(Renewed mercy)*

The Lord heard, and took pity on me; the Lord came to my help.

You turned my mourning into joy; You tore my sackcloth, and robed me in gladness:

That my glory might sing to You, and remorse never sting me: O Lord, my God, forever will I give You thanks!


