Make sure you go to her each and every day. I hope we all know how important this is. According to [www.catholicculture.org](http://www.catholicculture.org) "The physical heart of Mary is venerated (and not adored as the Sacred Heart of Jesus is) because it is united to her person and is the seat of her love (especially for her

divine Son), virtue, and inner life. Such devotion is an incentive to a similar love and virtue. This devotion has received new emphasis in this century from the visions given to Sister Maria Lúcia of Jesus and of the Immaculate Heart, oldest of the visionaries of Fatima, in her convent in Tuy, in Spain, in 1925 and 1926. In the visions Our Lady asked for the practice of the Five First Saturdays to help make amends for the offenses committed against her heart by the blasphemies and ingratitude of men. The practice parallels the devotion of the Nine First Fridays in honor of the Sacred Heart. On October 31, 1942, Pope Pius XII made a solemn Act of Consecration of the Church and the whole world to the Immaculate Heart. Let us remember this devotion year-round, but particularly through the month of August."

In August we will celebrate some very significant milestones. The Parish Patronal Feast Day is August 15, the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This year 2019, is also the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary year of this parish entering into full communion with the Catholic Church. The following week, August 22, Bishop Lopes will preside over our celebration of the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary *and* Dedication of our Altar. The bishop will also bless all that God and our Blessed Mother have given us in the way of improvements and enhancements to our Catholic parish. Please set aside that Thursday night and together may we offer our joyous thanks.


