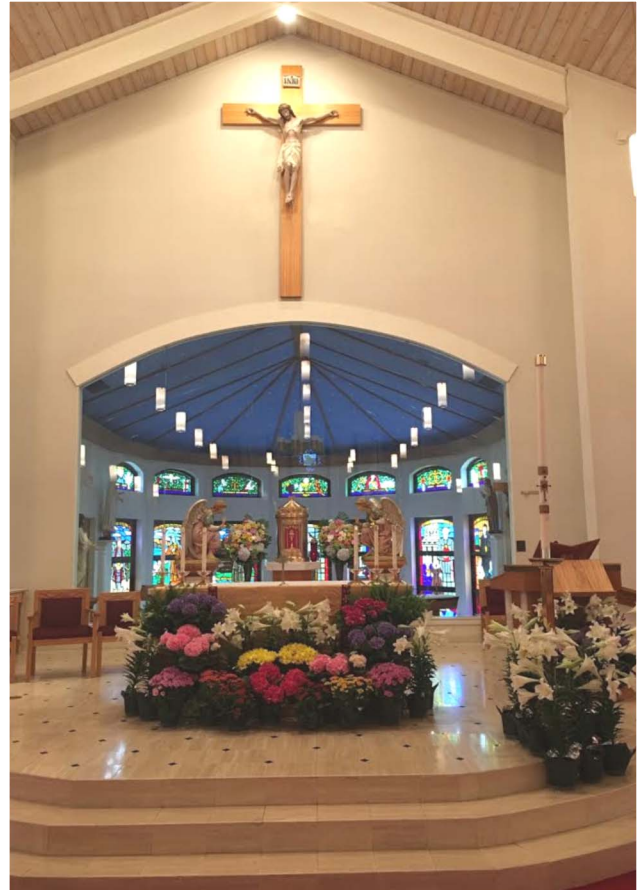

Bautismos en Español

Es necesario presentar una copia del acta de nacimiento del niño (a). Los padrinos si son esposos, deben de estar casados por la Iglesia Católica o tener fecha para celebrar el matrimonio. Después de los 7 años, los niños (as) deben tener una preparación especial antes del Bautismo (RICA). Si no cumplen con alguno de los anteriores requisitos deben hablar personalmente con el sacerdote.

Los bautismos se celebraran el **primer** y **tercer sábado** del mes. Es necesario registrase en la oficina.

Why Give Glory to Mary?

So we say, "Well then, why give glory and honor and devotion to Mary?" Because we do whatever Jesus tells us. And we do whatever Jesus does because the fundamental axiom of Christian morality is the imitatio Christi, the imitation of Christ, and he is the best of the best when it comes to being a son. Not only a Son of his heavenly Father but a Son of his earthly mother.

When he accepts the mission of his Father to become a man and to obey the law, he obeys it more perfectly than anybody could have ever imagined it being obeyed. And when he gets to that commandment, "Honor your father and your mother," that Hebrew word, kabodah, means bestow glory, comes from kabod weight, glory. So he honors his Father and obeys his command by bestowing unprecedented glory upon the one that he has chosen from all eternity to be his mother. The only time that the Creator created a human creature, created the one destined to be his mother. And he filled her with his own life and grace because he began honoring as soon as she was created his mother.

So what do we do? We honor Christ and we glorify him and we imitate him. If we really imitate him, we do what he does and we honor and bestow glory upon his mother. Not instead of him. It isn't undermining devotion to Christ. It's to express our devotion of Christ, our worship of Christ by imitating him. And if we do it we're going to be able to see in her face, the face of our mother, because Jesus has taken on her flesh and blood and given us his own Divine nature.

Peter says, "We are partakers of Divine nature through Christ" so that his mother can become our mother, spiritually, supernaturally, but actually and really. And so in devotion to him, we can be devoted to her without any compromise, without any tug of war, without any diminution or decrease of our honor to Christ.

Love is not a finite substance. God is love. Love just keeps multiplying and reproducing itself, and the more we love, the more love we have to give. And the more we love Christ, well, we know if there were 90 percent that goes to Christ and 10 percent that goes to Mary, 100 percent of it goes to God and the God-man and therefore 100 percent of it and more is available for us to give to others and especially his Mother who has become our Mother. Isn't that what Jesus is trying to say at the Cross when he says to the beloved disciple. He didn't say "John," he said "to the disciple he loved,

“Behold your Mother.”

Una razón clave por la que los católicos honran a María

Es una razón que podemos comprender cuando observamos a nuestras familias.
Allí donde Jesús está presente, también está presente su Madre. – Fulton J. Sheen

La devoción católica hacia María nunca me ha resultado fácil de entender. Sé que, para muchas personas, María fue el modo de descubrir y desarrollar verdaderamente una relación con Jesús. Para mí, sin embargo, ocurrió al contrario. Jesús fue el que me dio a conocer a su Madre. Conocía a Jesús años antes de desarrollar una relación con su Madre o incluso ver el motivo para hacerlo. Mi devoción hacia Jesús me llevó a crear una relación con María. De hecho, cada día tengo más claro que el amor por la Palabra con la que se reveló cuando nació es totalmente inseparable del amor por María.

Ningún bebé se puede separar de sus padres. Aunque un padre nunca cuide a su hijo, este transmitirá material genético a su descendencia. Esto también ocurre con Jesús. Puede que alguna vez lo hayas pensado, pero se trata de una reflexión que reaparece frecuentemente en mis oraciones: Jesús es 100% herencia genética de María.

Tal como Ignacio de Antioquía expresó en su carta a los trallianos: “Él, que crea a todos los hombres mientras se encuentran en el útero, también estuvo en el útero, y se hizo de él un cuerpo de la semilla de la Virgen”.

¡Jesús se tuvo que parecer mucho a su madre!

No sólo fue depositado en el útero de su madre, fue su verdadero descendente en su humanidad. Por esta razón, en el siglo V, el Concilio de Éfeso afirmó que podíamos llamar a María Theotokos, la Madre de Dios, porque María dio a luz a Jesús, una persona divina con dos naturalezas.

El misterio de la salvación nunca se puede separar de María, la madre humana de Jesús.

Lo mismo ocurre con la Eucaristía, la fuentes y culmen de nuestra fe. No tendríamos la Eucaristía si no fuese por la encarnación. Y Jesús no tendría cuerpo si no fuese por el fiat de la Virgen María. Algunas personas pueden argumentar que Dios podría haber adoptado una forma humana por cualquier método que hubiese elegido (San Anselmo discreparia). No obstante, lo importante es que Dios eligió encarnarse de forma que dependía de la aprobación de una humilde adolescente judía. Fue esta joven la que ofreció al Creador del Universo, la Palabra de Dios, un cuerpo humano.

Este vínculo entre la encarnación de la Palabra y la aceptación de María me ha ayudado a entender la devoción católica hacia ella. En el momento en que uno empieza a comprender el grandioso momento en la historia cuando Dios, Aquel sin principio ni fin, se tornó en humano, entonces es cuando empieza a entender la devoción mariana. Por supuesto, existen más razones por las que honramos a María, pero esta conexión es clave.

En el siglo VIII, San Juan Damasceno resumió este gran misterio en una homilía sobre la Asunción de María:

Por tanto, al reconocer a la Madre de Dios en su Virgen, la celebramos, no proclamándola como un Dios, sino reconociéndola como la Madre de un Dios encarnado, de forma que nos alejamos de las fábulas paganas

Honrar a María es honrar al plan de salvación de Dios. Honrar a María es arrodillarse con admiración ante la maravilla de que la encarnación fue posible con un simple “sí”.

María ofreció a Jesús su naturaleza humana mediante su entrega libre y aceptación sagrada.

Es un vínculo irremplazable en la historia de nuestra salvación, y por eso la honramos.

“El Padre disfruta al contemplar el corazón de la Santísima Virgen María, mientras que la obra maestra creada de sus manos... El Hijo celebra el corazón de su Madre, la fuente de la que derramó la sangre que nos salvó” – San Juan Bautista María Vianney
