We belong to one family. What is God's plan? It is to make of us all a single family of his children, in which each person feels that God is close and feels loved by him.

ST. JOSEPH; March 19th Feast Day. In obedience, Joseph took Mary to be his wife, knowing that she was with child by the power of God. His character was proven in repeated difficulties: the journey to Bethlehem, the sojourn into Egypt, the loss and then mysterious finding of the child Jesus in the Temple at Jerusalem. Joseph and Mary's self-giving love for each other formed a "Church in miniature" that protected and nurtured the child Jesus through his hidden years. Together, they formed the model for the Christian family. Having died in the company of Mary and Jesus, Joseph is considered the patron of a happy death. Like a tree planted near running water, Saint Joseph drew vigor and courage from his trust in God to enable him to care for the Mother and Child..

A form has been provided to all families which is required to request financial assistance. St. Rose attempts to make enrollment possible for as many families as we can by offering tuition assistance funds. Awards are funded by

the school's tuition pool and are awarded based on need. Awards are made annually, and an award one year does not guarantee an award thereafter. Applications are accepted in the annual enrollment time frame which ends **March 31, 2016**. Tuition assistance awards will be calculated based on annual income, the total number of children in the family, and the number of children enrolling at St. Rose. St. Rose will base tuition assistance grants on the data provided with the application and through the FACTS Tuition Aid verified application. Depending on the data from each family and the availability of funds, St. Rose may award the full amount of tuition, a lesser amount, or no amount. In each case, St. Rose will seek to be equitable and generous to the extent we are able. Families will not be considered for tuition assistance until the tuition assistance applications with supporting documentation are complete and submitted. In addition to the Parish Subsidy, there are other sources of tuition assistance to families.

1) Ed Choice Expansion – This amount can vary. The maximum is \$4,560.00. This is available through the Ohio Dept. of Education. Available to students in grades Kindergarten through third grade. 2) The Diocese of Columbus Tuition Assistance (www.factsstuitionaid.com). Only one application per family. And 3) Due to the generosity of St. Rose supporters, we have started several scholarships.
