April 29th is the deadline for Ed-Choice Expansion Scholarships. It is absolutely critical that you renew this scholarship. Mrs. Medaugh will assist you in this process. Please call the school office if you have any issues. The number is 740-342-3043.

All Parish Subsidy Forms and Non-member Tuition Scholarship forms are due by May 13th.

May 16-May 27— Parish Subsidy Tuition Assistance and Non-Member Scholarships will be awarded.

Students may still register throughout the summer. While we will still honor Parish Subsidy Forms and the Non-Member Tuition Assistance Forms, no named scholarships will be awarded after May 27th.

We have four named scholarships this year. They are: Msgr. James J. Carroll Scholarship, Fr. Jack Dreese Scholarship, Coach Bob Fowle Scholarship, and The Daniel and Barbara Mooney Scholarship. It is the intention of St. Rose Catholic School to award money from these scholarships to cover the increase in next year's tuition. These scholarships have limited funds available and once they are depleted, no additional scholarships will be awarded. They are awarded on a first-come, first-serve basis. These scholarships are in addition to the Parish Subsidy. Anyone wanting to donate to these scholarships may do so.

After finishing Forming Intentional Disciples by Sherry A. Weddell, the more I read, the more I became concerned with the school's mission statement. "St. Rose School shares in the Catholic Church's mission to make and be disciples of Christ." I always thought that being a "disciple" was being a "follower." And I always thought being a follower was easy. After all, the only requirements were to follow Jesus around, be nice to people, and do the occasional Corporal Works of Mercy. But, after finishing the book, I realized that being a disciple required a little more of me than following Jesus around all day. Being a disciple required some thought. It required some effort. It required some doing. Forming Intentional Disciples and Story of the Storm both paint a pretty bleak picture of Catholic education. A 2008 Pew report stated that 30% of Americans who were raised Catholic attend Mass once a month, 38% still consider themselves Catholic but rarely go to Mass, and 32% of Americans who were raised Catholic no longer consider themselves Catholics, at all. The report also stated that half of all cradle Catholics have left the

Faith by the time they are eighteen. It didn't matter if they went to CCD, Catholic high school, or attended youth group meetings. They were gone. Research has also revealed that the majority of adult Catholics are not even certain that a personal relationship with God is possible. It also reveals that marriages in the Catholic Church have declined by 60% from 1972-2010, and that since many people are not getting married in the Church, they are not bothering to raise their children in the Faith. It is easy to be discouraged by these facts, but at the same time it makes me very, very grateful. It makes me proud to serve a parish who, despite the odds, elects to support a school; Who, despite all the demands on their time, continue to coach, continue to help out with meals, continue to pay for our school, continue to volunteer in the school, and continue to send their children to St. Rose School and take them to Mass. We do have a good thing here. Let's keep the schools mission statement in mind and endeavor to make our students disciples of Jesus.

Where the books differ, is *Forming Intentional Disciples* offers some solutions. The main thrust of the book is that many Catholics do not have a personal relationship with Christ. The 29% of us who do go to Mass on a regular basis are often disengaged. In order to create this personal relationship with Christ we need to pray. We need to read about the heroes of our Faith. We need to spend time reflecting and listening for God's voice. We need to be active participants in Mass.

As I prepare for the future of our school, I keep coming back to the thought that we have to use the school to evangelize our community. In 1912, our forefathers created St. Rose School to perpetuate the Catholic Faith. They were interested in creating disciples. I'm guessing that they were hoping to create disciples who could read, write, and run a business as well. I have read that God has no grandchildren. One book I read stated that it only takes three generations to kill off a church. The grandparents build it. The children take it for granted and leave and then there is no one to teach the next generation. We are every fortunate at St. Rose that several of our children bear the last names of church members whose names are on our stained glass windows. Our church and our school can be proud of the fact that we have created disciples of all ages. It now becomes our task to create the next generation of disciples.

As we wind down this year and prepare for the next, I want to thank you for all the support you have given the school. In my mind, there is only one reason to have this school open and that is to create **Disciples of Christ**. If our students and families are truly striving to be disciples then everything will fall into place. Being a Catholic School Family means making sacrifices of our time, talents and treasures. Our families have donated

over 2,700 hours to school projects. Your willingness to share your talents with the school and the greater church community have not gone unnoticed. Many of your families have been very generous in the terms of financial giving and I will be working very hard between now and the end of May to make sure that St. Rose Catholic School is a good steward of your donations and tuition payments. During the Easter season I was reflecting on the Stations of the Cross. The two stations that I always come back to are Veronica and Joseph of Arimathea. These two characters in the drama did what was right. They did what was needed. Their acts were selfless and neither of these characters was expecting a reward. It's always fascinating for me to see someone do something genuine and selfless. As I have mentioned many times, I am an avid St. Louis Blues fan. In February, an eleven-year-old fan, Noah Kleinlehrer, was tossed a stick that Vladimire Tarasenko had used. Without hesitation, Noah took this stick walked seven rows down to a small child and handed him the stick. Why? Because Noah had overhead someone say that it was that little boy's first hockey game. Noah did it without hesitation, without any thought of his own loss. I realize that it is a long stretch from the Stations of the Cross to an NHL game, but it's nice to know that the spirit of giving and helping has somehow transcended time and that same spirit exists here among the supporters of St. Rose Catholic School. Bishop Robert Barron had this to say about the gift of healing: "Faith, prayer, and an acceptance of God's will are necessary for this gift." Are you the kind of person who heals others, who brings calm and peace, who soothes troubled psyches and spirits? If so, how generously are you putting this gift to the service of others?
