POPE FRANCIS: The Church is everyone's Home.

Each one of us can ask himself or herself today: How do I live in the Church? When I go to church, is it as though I were at the stadium, at a football game? Is it as though I were at the cinema? No, it is something else. How do I go to Church? How do I receive the gifts that the Church offers me to grow and mature as a Christian? Do I participate in the life of the community or do I go to Church and withdraw into my own problems, isolating myself from others? In this first sense, the Church is catholic because she is everyone's home. Everyone is a child of the Church, and in her all find their home.

The Door to the Church

The third door of our lives is the door to the Church. The Church door is the silent witness to all the moments of our lives. It is at this door that the priest or deacon first welcomes the parents of the newborn child and reminds them of the joy that embraced them when first they held that child in their arms. The same Church door looks down years later when the child arrives to be married as the priest receives the couple and greets them in a warm and friendly manner, showing that the Church shares their joy. Finally that door stands witness at the end of life as the body of the deceased Christian is received into the Church at the beginning of the funeral liturgy. The door is the door to salvation, the portal of the Kingdom of God. Thus at the dedication of a church the bishop invites the people to enter through these doors for the first time with the words: "Go within his gates giving thanks, enter his courts with songs of praise."

Mrs. Gable has called everyone who has not sent in a registration. I believe we have all students who intend to come to St. Rose registered. In next week's note, I will be announcing class sizes, alignments, and staffing. The combined field day with Holy Trinity will be May 17th at the Somerset Park. The event will begin about 9:30 a.m. with a short prayer service. After lunch, St. Rose students will be returning to St. Rose. Our staff intends to conduct afternoon classes so students should plan on returning to school. Be advised that we will need drivers and the students will need sack lunches. Drinks will be provided.

St. Rose alumnus, Emily Vigue, has just concluded her freshman year at Marietta College where she is an honors student. She is in the International Leadership Program as well. She is currently on her first Mission building bunk beds for the children on an Indian Reservation in South Dakota. Once she finishes this project, she will head to West Virginia where she will spend ten weeks as a counselor at High Rock Academy. At High Rock, she will be helping girls to develop positive attitudes that will help them in high school. I'd like to think that St. Rose School has had a small part helping Emily develop into the fine person she has become.

On May 6th, we hosted Breakfast with the Buckeyes, which will increase our exposure in the community, and we celebrated Mary Crowning which reaches back to the roots of our Faith. I am grateful for the opportunity to celebrate both events.

As this year closes, I am already working on things for next year. We will continue to work on the inside of the school and finish projects I was not able to finish last year. We are seeking funds to replace the back doors of the school building. Each door costs approximately \$1,500.00. This week we received \$100.00 from the F.O.E. #2070 as "start-up" for this project.

We were contacted by an official from the Providence Foundation this week. Our application for tuition assistance money made it to the final review. We are hoping for the best. We have made some positive gains this year and I am hopeful there are more to come.
