MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR:

There is a piece of advice for those preparing for marriage: never yell at each other unless the house is on fire. There is a similar piece of advice for a new pastor: in the first year, make no change unless it is absolutely necessary. That's my plan/agenda for this year: make no change unless it is absolutely necessary or inevitable. But I would like to begin the process of planning for the future, and I would like to concentrate this effort in what I see as the essential works of the parish: Proclamation of the Gospel, celebration of the sacraments, faith formation of children, faith formation of adults, and brick and mortar needs of the parish. I don't want to develop "my plan" or "my agenda." I want to work with each of the four parishes of the consortium to develop the best plan for the parish as a whole, and for each of the individual parishes. We are not starting with a blank slate, we have a working program in place and "if it ain't broke, don't fix it." At the same time, we can improve what we are doing and we may need to make some changes.

I want to emphasize that I see this as a time of information gathering, discussion, and planning. To start this process, I would like to hold a "town-hall" style meeting in each of the parishes on the following dates: August 25th at St. Rose, September 1st at St. Bernard, September 8th at Church of the Atonement, and September 15th at St. Patrick. Each of the meetings will start at 7:00 p.m. and will end at 8:30 p.m. The goal and intention of the meeting is to gather information regarding the hopes and concerns of each of the parishes so that we may begin to build plans for the future. It would not be appropriate to use these meetings to air grievances of the past. I encourage everyone to leave any such grievance in the past and let us together work for the future.

Father Haddad and I are new to Perry County. I believe these town hall meetings will help us get to know you better, to learn of your parish concerns, and to begin the discussions necessary for improving our ministry in the future. I look forward to our time together.



POPE FRANCIS:

Rules for the Journey: "Thank You." It seems so easy to say these words, but we know that it is not. But it is important! We teach it to children, but then we ourselves forget it! Gratitude is an important sentiment!

An old woman once said to me in Buenos Aires, "Gratitude is a flower that grows on a noble ground." Nobility of soul is necessary so that this flower might grow. Do you remember the Gospel of Luke? Jesus heals ten lepers and then only one returns to say thank you to Jesus. The Lord says, "And the other nine, where are they? (cf. Luke 17:11-19). This also holds true for us: do we know how to give thanks? In your relationship, and in married life, it is important to keep alive the awareness that the other person is a gift from God – and for gifts of God, we say thank you, we must always give thanks for them. And in this interior attitude one says "thank you" to the other for everything. It is not a kind word to use with strangers, to show you are polite. You need to know how to say thank you in order to go forward in a good way in life.

God, in His healing mercy, often requires patience from us, but we creatures of time want our comfort right away. We would steal His lordship of time. But, the Father is wise, and knows not only what to give, but when to give.

AROUND THE DIOCESE:

ST. PEREGRINE: Patron Saint of Cancer Patients

In 2010, Bishop Fredrick Campbell and the Diocesan Council of Catholic Women launched a cancer response initiative – Catholic for Cancer Prevention and Cure. In 2016, this initiative was renamed the St. Peregrine Fund. The purpose of the fund is to provide resources for cancer screening, ethical research, and outreach to individuals and families dealing with all forms of cancer. In Pope Francis’ apostolic exhortation, *Evangelii Gaudium* (The Joy of the Gospel), we are called to respond to the Gospel, to live it more fully and more deeply, to reach out to the poor and broken, to end injustice, to build peace, and to find the joy in all of it. The St. Peregrine Fund seeks the active involvement of all 106 parishes, 11 Catholic high schools, and 42 elementary schools by challenging them to create small, medium, and large money-making events. One hundred percent of all donations will be divided equally among our: Mount Carmel Healthcare Foundation in Columbus, the Genesis Healthcare Foundation in Zanesville, the Trinity Hospital Twin City Foundation in Dennison, and the Stefanie Spielman Fund for Breast Cancer.
