ST. ROSE SCHOOL INFORMATION:

*St. Rose School (SRS) received an offer from one of our parents to pay for window air conditioners for each classroom. It was recommended to the parent to instead get a quote for central air. We are in the process of getting a quote. There are concerned parishioners and staff who have suggested that we wait on air and get the windows replaced first as well as the roof. The roof is in critical need of replacement followed by windows then air conditioning. At this point, we are at a stand still as to how we wish to move forward on these projects. We pray for our Parish Leadership Team to give us direction.

*St. Rose Preschool: We are excited to announce St. Rose will open this August! We have nine registered. To open, we need more students. Preschool applications can be picked up at the SRS Office. In order to be approved for a preschool license, we must put up a fence around the playground equipment on the High Street side of the playground, A and B Fence, LLC has been awarded the contract. The fence will be installed within five weeks. Also, to meet licensing requirements the gravel underneath the playground equipment must be removed and replaced with either 12 inches of mulch or shredded recycled tires. Thank you and God Bless Mr. and Mrs. Tim and Kelly Baker and family for volunteering to take care of the ordering, delivering and spreading the mulch. We also thank them for paying for half of the mulch. We thank Jeremiah Boyden for paying for the other half. The 25 yards of mulch came from Alfman Brothers Logging, LLC, in Crooksville, at a cost of \$500.00

*Attention, next year’s SRS 8th grade students and parents. The 8th grade class trip will return to Niagara Falls next May (tentatively May 15, 16, 17). We have taken the offer from the Sisters of St. Francis to stay at their Retreat Center for two nights. The cost is only \$40.00 per person per night.

*Enrollment – Currently SRS has 90 students registered in grades K-8, with 9 preschoolers registered..

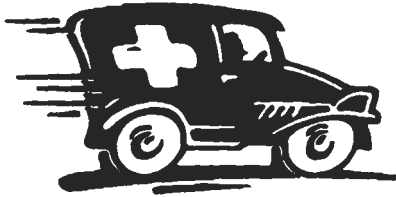

TIPS TO HELP THE EARTH! Be the “Green” example at your summer parties! This is the season of graduations, weddings, and all kinds of outside celebrations! Please consider these ideas for a more sustainable lifestyle:

Use reusable or biodegradable plates and utensils. Use paper plates with reusable support baskets!

Fill up pitchers of water, homemade lemonade and iced tea instead of buying huge quantities of personalized beverage containers.
