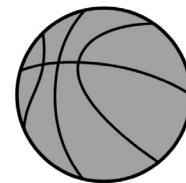
AROUND THE DIOCESE

Natural Disasters – Catastrophic disasters in the forms of hurricanes, earthquakes, floods, and fires are dominating the news and severely impacting our brothers and sisters. First, please pray for all people, and secondly thank you for the support you have provided. Catholic Charities (domestic) and Catholic Relief Services (international) are providing services. It is clear that the road to full recovery will be a long one. In times of tragedy, we are reminded that the Church is always a primary source of healing and peace. However, as is so often the case, the Church itself in these regions is both a source of help and aid as well as a victim. Many of the Church's are damaged and their resources depleted, which makes it more difficult to fulfill the mission or providing aid, comfort, and pastoral outreach to those in need. Please do not donate unsolicited goods such as used clothing, miscellaneous household items, medicine, or perishable foodstuffs. When items are donated, the helping agencies must redirect their staff away from providing direct services to survivors to sort, package, transport, warehouse, distribute and discard items that may not meet the needs of disaster survivors. Most importantly, please be patient. Although the need is great, and desire to help strong, it is important to avoid donating material goods or self-deploying to help until communities are safe and public officials and disaster relief organizations have had an opportunity to assess the damage and identify what the unmet specific needs are. As the situation changes, needs also change. Continue monitoring traditional and social media channels to learn more. God Bless you for your assistance!

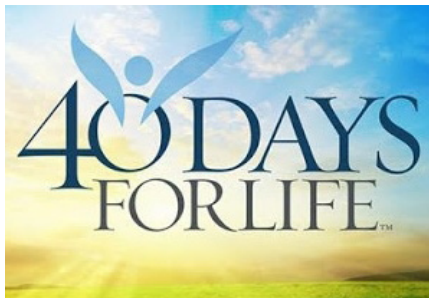
SHARE THE JOURNEY MIGRATION CAMPAIGN:
