

WORLD DAY FOR THE ABOLITION OF THE DEATH PENALTY – NOVEMBER 30, 2018

All life is sacred and precious and that includes an unborn child, a murderer on death row and the elderly in the last days of life. Cardinal Bernardin said, “When human life is considered cheap or easily expendable in one area, eventually nothing is held as sacred and all lives are in jeopardy.”

In view of this, there is a strong movement in Catholic America to end the use of the death penalty. To help in this regard, it is important to review Catholic teaching on this issue.

From the Bible:

- Vengeance is mine. I will repay, says the Lord. Romans 12:19
- The Lord puts to death and gives Life. First Samuel 2:6
- Thou shall not kill. 5th Commandment

Our Catechism teaches us that the use of the death penalty is only allowed in those cases where non-lethal means are insufficient to defend and protect peoples’ safety from an aggressor. In this case, the death penalty would be allowed but according to Pope St. John Paul II, “this is very rare and practically non-existent.” In our state, juries can choose life without parole for convicted killers and this has worked well. They are locked up for life and none has escaped, a severe punishment. Society is well protected.

Given the development of the doctrine involving the death penalty, in August of this year, Pope Francis revised the instruction concerning the execution of human beings in stating: “the death penalty is inadmissible because it is an attack on the inviolability and dignity of the person”, and furthermore, called for the Church to work with determination for its abolition worldwide.

Some facts to consider:

- There is no credible evidence that capital punishment is a deterrent.
- In Florida, because of appeals, it is more expensive to execute someone compared to life without parole.
- The death penalty discriminates against the poor because they cannot afford a private attorney.
- There have been 26 exonerations in Florida due to evidence of wrongful conviction, highest in our nation.
- There are approximately 400 people awaiting execution on Florida’s Death Row.
- The top five executing nations of the world are: China, Iran, Pakistan, Saudi Arabia and the United States

CHURCH PARKING

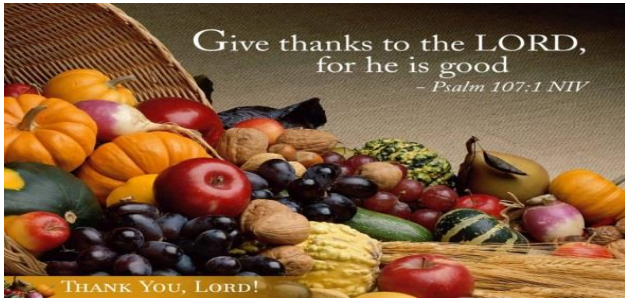

Please phone the Parish Office, 878-1215, with any changes to your registration ... address, phone, baptisms, deaths. We pride ourselves in keeping parish data current.

SACRAMENTS AND CELEBRATIONS

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: At least one parent must be an active, participating, and registered as a member of the parish. Parental attendance at a two-hour preparatory workshop is required prior to the baptism. The class is usually offered in English on the second Wednesday of every month, and in Spanish on the first Wednesday of every month. Class begins at 7:00 PM in the Parish Office Conference Room located at 425 SW Irving Street. **Parents are asked to phone the Parish Office before the class to confirm date and time.** All baptismal requirements are outlined in a booklet that will be distributed at the baptismal class. Upon fulfilling and submitting the baptism booklet, all is reviewed and if all requirements have been met, a date for baptism will be set (but no sooner than one month.) Baptisms are celebrated at 12:45 PM on Sundays. Spanish Baptisms: 1st and 3rd Sundays, English Baptisms: 2nd and 4th Sundays.

SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION: Please contact Andrea Draper, SOFS, Director of Religious Education, for more information. Call (772) 878-1215. Older candidates wishing to be confirmed must first complete an adult religious education program.

SACRAMENT OF FIRST EUCHARIST: First Eucharist is usually celebrated in the second grade. Parents who are registered members of the parish are to contact the Director of Religious Education at (772) 878-1215 to register their child for the First Eucharist Program beginning first grade. Preparation is a two-year program!

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: Marriages are celebrated on Fridays at various times and Saturdays at 11:00 AM and 1:00 PM only. Engaged couples should contact the church office a minimum of six months in advance in order to complete the necessary preparation. At least one member of the couple **MUST** be a registered and participating member of the parish for a minimum of six months prior to initially contacting the church. If the annulment of a previous marriage (Catholic, Non-Catholic, or civil) is required before a Catholic remarriage can take place, please contact the Annulment Advocate, Anne Tienter. For more information call (772) 878-1215.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION: Reconciliation is celebrated each Saturday from 2:30 – 3:30 PM in the church, or by prearranged appointment with one of the staff priests. It is also celebrated on First Friday from 7:00 to 7:20 AM and 8:00 to 8:20 AM. Seasonal Reconciliation services are also held during both Advent and Lent. “First Reconciliation” for children is celebrated each February for second grade religious education students. Contact the Parish Religious Education Office for information.
