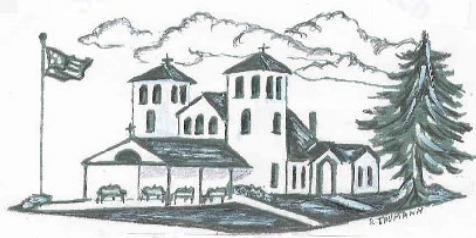
MARRIAGE:
